What do you enjoy doing in your spare time? I enjoy doing anything music related (listening to, writing, playing, etc.), being outdoors, and drinking coffee.


One thing you cannot live without? Probably music. And also coffee. Music and coffee.




We are looking with anticipation to Grace's 50th Anniversary Celebration in September.

Outdoor Baptism Service







We all have our favorites and wish some of the colors could stay in place longer, but being on Liturgical Arts, we know we must change the colors, as we all must change ourselves during the seasons of the church year. We constantly strive to add more texture and beauty during the seasons. Who and What is a Parish Nurse?

Hello, everyone! My name is Lily Tunby, and together with Lori Ackerson, we are the Parish Nurses at Grace Lutheran Church.

We both had the privilege to go to Haiti in the Summer of 2012. I saw firsthand the impact that nursing can have on a community, and I came back with urge to serve. I'm sure my fellow trip takers, both past and future, have felt the same way. I wasn't sure what I could do to fulfill this urge. I know it seems silly now; she's a nurse so of course she should do that. But at the time, I didn't know what or how nursing would work in our church. I did know about parish nursing as a role, but only a basic understanding. Honestly, I wasn't sure of myself in being able to meet the needs of our church, especially praying with individuals. Now I know that I'm not the only one who may feel this way. I continue to work on these, with God's help, of course.

Eventually, my urge to serve led me to ask a question to Jeannie Hellmann. "Does Grace (Lutheran

Andover) have a parish nurse?" I was thinking it was a simple question, and I could meet with the parish nurse if there was one. However, she promptly caught Pastor Mark's attention to inform him of my question and then I was being connected with Lori in an effort to start a parish nurse ministry. Any-

one who's ever asked a question like this to Pastor Mark knows that this result is kind of inevitable. Keep in mind, Pastor Mark never told Lori and I that we must continue along with it, but we did anyway. Looking back though, it was the push I needed to catapult me to where I am today.

You might be wondering, "What is parish nursing"? Well, I'm glad you asked. Parish nursing is a combination of the physical and emotional health of a congregation, but also most importantly their spiritual health. As nurses, Lori and I learned to care for person as a whole, mind, body, and spirit. All aspects work together to define who they are as a person and maintain a balance that represents health. While our healthcare system focuses on the body's health and some extent the health of the mind. Parish nurses try to pick up where traditional healthcare leaves off, not a replacement.

So what does this mean for you? Lori and I are here to support you and your family, whether it be a health crisis or you need more information on healthy behaviors. Here's a listing of the services we provide:

On request:

- Education (diagnosis and medication)
- Provider and agency referrals
- Post hospitalization orders review (discharge instructions, medication review)
- In-home or hospital visits (for education, spiritual care, healing prayer)

Scheduled:

Parish Nurse

- Blood pressure checks (on Connection weekends or by request)
- Flu shot clinics with Walgreens Pharmacy (first weekend in October)
 - * Most insurance accepted; check with your insurance provider, you may have co-pays for this service.
 - * Medication checks also offered at this event, bring any medications that need disposal (expired) or that you may have questions about.
 - * Blood pressure checks will be offered as well.

So please let us know what needs are out there. We do have our Flu Shot Clinic coming up on October 7th from 9am to 12pm with Walgreen's Pharmacy. They accept most insurance plans, but you should check with your insurance provider if a copay will apply.

I enjoy being your parish nurse, but I know I could be better. Let's GROW together in this ministry, after all I couldn't be a parish nurse without you. I hope to CONNECT with the congregation more deeply to SERVE you better with the hope that we can be better EQUIPPED to go out into the world. After all, that's the heart of being LUTHERAN. Question: What's the plan for the portables?

Answer: This is what we know. We have a permit to keep the portables until December of 2019. Then they have to be removed. We can ask the city of Andover for an extension to continue using the portables, if we have a plan in place for replacing them.

We have formed a team of people called the Construction Team headed by Neil Hawkinson. They are evaluating how the building is being used, the parts of the building being used, and what upcoming improvements will need to be done. (Examples are new flat roofs over the day care portion of the building and replacement of parking lot.) The Daycare will be included in our conversations as well. Golden Rule continues to thrive and would like to grow. They are being limited by the space we provide for them. They have tried to start a preschool but are finding it difficult with them being in the portables.

The construction team will work with the Vision Board and the Finance Team to come up with a plan to finance needed improvements. It is our goal to keep the congregation informed.
