It's hard to believe another ministry year at Grace is rapidly coming to a close! Lent is over and we are deep into our 7 week Easter GOD'S PROMISE UNLEASHED celebration. Confirmation is just a few weeks away, and there are a few more SONday School sessions left. Like marathon runners coming near the finish line, it's time for a last burst of speed so we can finish well.

We invite you to consider how you might gear up and sprint in these next couple of weeks:

- * Just 1 More Step Race on Saturday, May 6th at Bunker Hills Park to help support World Wide Village's special projects: a house for Grace's Abandoned Children and City on a Hill – medical & education outreach. It doesn't matter if you are a runner or a walker. There's a spot for you! If you're busy that day, you can also support someone by pledging a dollar amount for each kilometer run! Once again, the Just 1 More 5K is a great opportunity for you to sharpen your serving habit as you work on your health.
- Family Worship on Sunday, May 7th as we welcome our children in worship. There will be a special extended Children's Sermon and then the children will be dismissed to their classes. There will be no Connection Time in the Fellowship Hall after the services.
- Feed My Starving Children Packing Event on Friday, May 19th at 12 pm (noon) at the FMSC building in Coon Rapids to help starving children throughout our world. What better way to train yourself in your serving ability than taking two hours out of your afternoon to make a difference in the world.
- Blessing of the Bikes on Sunday, May 21 at 12 pm (noon) in the Parking Lot. Bring your bikes and motorcycles for a special blessing for safety travel and recreation. We'll meet in the Church parking lot.
- * Last Day of SONday School Celebration on Sunday, May 21. We will cheer the 5th graders who will graduate. All the rest of the students will be in their classrooms, saying "see you in the fall" to teacher and friends.
- Red Cross Blood Drive on Tuesday, May 23 from 12-5pm. You can make an appointment by signing up at www.redcross.org or calling 1(800) REDCROSS.

So, we might be close to this year's ministry finish line, but there's still a lot of opportunity to put on the last burst of speed. Let's keep going!

Pastor Mark's Remarks

Well, I did a first during the baptisms last Sunday. I tried to give a baby away! Yes, that's right...I got momentarily confused as I tried to give the infant into the arms of the father, but he refused to accept her! I was shocked, so I tried to put the baby into his arms again, but he refused a second time.

By this time I was totally confused, thinking, "Please help me out here, Dad!" Finally, the father said something like: "Pastor Mark, she isn't mine. I already have three! But if you want, I'll take another." It was then I realized my mistake as I saw the other father anxiously reaching out for the child I had in my arms. I had mixed up the parents!

So, everyone had a good laugh at my mistake, including me. I have to admit, I've made more than enough mistakes over the years, but this one took the cake! The good news was no one (including the parents) seemed too concerned and the service went on.

This little (OK...it was a bit bigger than little) mishap reminded once more how good it is to be in a grace-filled community like our church. I'm convinced everyone needs a place to be real; everyone needs a place where they can make mistakes and be forgiven; and, I believe everyone needs a place to be able to forgive others because there just isn't enough forgiveness in our world today.

This is what the Easter season of God's Promise of New Life unleashed at the Empty Tomb is all about! It is when God said "Yes!" to all that Jesus had accomplished at the cross. At the empty tomb, death did not have the final word! Forgiveness did! And just as we celebrate God unleashing new life into his world, we also celebrate his forgiveness that flows out as well.

So, how do we keep this unleashed New Life flowing in our world? Maybe it is starting small by intentionally practicing forgiveness in our own lives! For instance, could we live more in the flow of forgiveness if we:

Write the words "forgive as we have been forgiven" on an index card and tape to the dashboard of our car when we go out driving on a freeway? Would that help us when someone cuts in front of us?

- * Find a news story in the paper or online where you think forgiveness is especially needed. Keep praying for forgiveness to flow into that situation.
- Look up some Bible verses about forgiveness and tape one on the bathroom or type it into your screen saver. (Possibilities: Eph. 4:32; Col. 3:13; Matt. 6:12-15; Prov. 17:9)
- * Start a "Forgiveness Diary and Prayer Book" to keep track of the moments when you have experienced forgiveness anew or been able to share it with someone.
- Pray as you walk across the parking lot to school or work that God would make you an instrument of his peace and forgiveness to those around you.

You get the idea. There are multitudes of opportunities for us to grow our habit of forgiveness in our lives. And, as we do, we get in the Spirit's flow of forgiveness begun at Empty Tomb.

So, whether you find yourself in a funny situation where you accidently make a mistake like trying to give a baby away (I hope that doesn't ever happen again!) or whether you have truly hurt someone deeply and you need forgiveness, may you find those places of grace-filled forgiveness and acceptance to shape and change you more into the person Jesus wants you to be!

Competitive Pack Team Wins!

Congratulations to the Grace's Feed My Starving Children Competitive Pack Team which was awarded the Food Heroes Fundraising Champions Award for raising the most financial support at the recent competition on Friday, March 24th! Competing against four other teams, Grace collected the most money to help shoulder the cost of supplies for the Competitive Pack. As a result, we received a beautiful trophy-plate that is currently displayed on the narthex shelving until the next Competitive Pack when it will be given to the next winning team.



Perhaps you're wondering what a Competitive Pack is all about...it's an invitation only event held two times a year among those agencies and churches which are most active in Feed My Starving Children. It is a highenergy and intensive event where teams are timed and encouraged to pack as many meals as possible. Spills, incorrect packing, and waste are all judged and subtracted from the total number of boxes each team packs. It's a wild frenzy night of packing and it's a lot of fun, too!

We were excited that 20 members and friends of Grace participated in the packing event. Together with the other teams, we packed a total of 160 boxes which is more than has ever been packed at the Coon Rapids facility in such an event! As a result, 95 children will be fed for a year.

A Reality Far from "My Normal" ~ by Kurt Hellmann

The December air is cool, relatively speaking. The weather peaks around 85 during midday and a constant breeze encourages many to wear heavier clothing. The trees are losing their bright color as the rains have lessened. The rice fields are nearing their second harvest while the canal waters disappear.

Today we are in the Sam Lot district, in southwestern Battambang, near the Thai border. We are teaching fifteen community members how to raise and vaccinate chickens. I've found that chicken-raising is quite the undertaking as growing and selling healthy/profitable chickens is a very meticulous process. The hope is that each chicken farmer will improve their raising techniques and empower others. Having cascading livelihood effects across entire communities.

During the training, I sit and listen. I also take pictures to help my coworkers document this community-empowerment activity. As I sit, observe, and click with the camera, I write down questions that I'll be sure to ask my coworkers later for further clarification and understanding.

Suddenly an explosion sounds off and shakes the ground beneath me. In nanoseconds my body jolts out of its sitting position prepared to run away from danger. I look to my coworkers and class participants for emergency instruction, but they remain in their seats completely unfazed and look at me with confusion. Then laughter spills into the air at my blatant fear and alarm. A coworker, while still chuckling, explains that the explosion was only a mine that detonated. How is that supposed to make me feel better?! He went on to say that it was a planned detonation, perhaps a few hundred meters away. I sigh with (little) relief and try to calm myself down to bring my mind back to chickens. Unfortunately, I had no such luck. The rest of the day all I could think about were mines. The loud explosion was too powerful to disregard, and the distress that followed, too persistent.

Later in the afternoon I learned that mine sweeping operations got underway in the late 1990's and has primarily prioritized clearing immediate public and household areas. This strategy has unintentionally yielded fragmented plots of safe land, sometimes with mines and other UXO potentially lying only hundreds of meters from a school, health center, or major roadway. In the face of poverty, farmers turn to cultivating the fertile land, sometimes taking the opportunity in uncleared areas to build up a livelihood amidst the danger of serious injury or death beneath the soil.

Even after roughly two decades of mine clearing operations, hidden and misplaced UXO still provide massive obstacles to economic development in parts of Cambodia. To address this issue, LWD partners with mine-clearing organizations and local governments. De-mining operations are conducted by various groups while LWD staff work with community leaders to catalyze development projects and activities in the recently cleared areas. Chicken-raising is just one of many community-based projects that attempts to strengthen livelihood through diversified income and sustainable practice.

Before departing for the day, several coworkers and I soaked in the picturesque landscape one last time. The mountains, hills, and trees seemed endless. An individual walked up behind us and asked if I wanted to race up a hill in the (not so far) distance. "Whoever makes it alive to the top wins", he joked. I initially took the man's remark as an insensitive joke, but after further thought I believe it was instead a reflection of normalcy to a reality I can't begin to fully understand. UXO have been a part of life in this area for decades, the presence of UXO are indeed 'normal', as disturbing as that may sound. By that, I am far from attempting to insinuate a sense of complacency among the people here-in fact, community members work tirelessly to improve their lives through demining campaigns despite their limited resources. Rather, I am genuinely and utterly stupefied in the realization of what 'normal' can mean. My privileged upbringing cannot possibly understand the term in this part of Cambodia. The unnerved reaction of people hearing a mine suddenly explode or casual joke about a deadly footrace are proof of that.

As I continue to live and learn in western Cambodia, I may never fully comprehend the reality of the war remnants continuing to plague livelihood and safety. But my hope is to not only learn more about the historical context of this country, but to bear witness to the inspiring community-focused coalition that continues to persevere and work towards a more safe and sustainable livelihood for Cambodian people. Lastly, I hope to constantly wrestle with how the word 'normal' is used and what it means for different regions of the world. In Peace, Kurt
