ADVENT AT GRACE

In all this busyness, we invite you to take time to come to church each week and pause for just an hour or so to worship and avoid the rush. Each week we will look at how God's people waited for the promise of the Savior of the world to be born. Perhaps we too can use these weeks of waiting, to prepare ourselves to celebrate Christmas once more.

CHRISMAS AT GRACE

For those who are new to Grace, we celebrate Christmas in a "BIG way." We have five different worship services on Christmas Eve to give everyone an opportunity to include worship amidst all the family activities.

The first two are early Family Services (2 & 4 pm) which offer an extended children's sermon and a special gift for children. The next service (7 pm) has a more "contemporary" feel to it, as well as candlelight singing. The last two (9 & 11 pm) services will be joyous traditional candlelight services with lots of special choral music. And after the "BIG" celebrations of Christmas Eve, we gather in the quiet of Christmas morning to share

the story of the Shepherds, and gather around the Lord's Table for a reflective "Quiet Communion" ser-

vice (10am).

Pastor Mark's Remarks

God's Promise IS for Everyone... even in Rakai!

It is one thing to talk and preach about God's Promise for everyone. But it is an entirely different matter to experience it! I'm talking about the joy and excitement at seeing firsthand, the ways God is working in Rakai, Uganda.

People have asked Jeannie and I about our trip and I find myself at a loss. I met so many people and witnessed countless ways of how God is working through the sponsorship of children, the Amazing Grace Bakery, the new school, and the Hope Again Women Project. The overriding sense was hope – hope that comes from God's promise of rescue, redemption, and restoration.

Perhaps the best way of sharing it is to share part of the email I wrote to Richard Mutaawe soon after our return:

Dear Richard,

Just a short word to express a large amount of thanks for our wonderful visit we had with you, Johnson, the RODI staff, and all the children! My heart is so full of so many emotions - gratitude, thanksgiving, praise, compassion, and hope. I can't seem to get my mind and heart around it all. So many people at Grace want to know how our trip went. I find it challenging to adequately express and describe all that we experienced. I also realize that I will never sum up all that happened, as well as how wonderful the ministry you and Richard, with the counsel of Ann, have developed. All I can say is: "Praise God for giving you the vision, fortitude, strength and passion to be his instruments of healing and grace! I admire you and what God has done through you!

I really meant what I wrote, for what impressed me the most was the vision of reclaiming and restoring the lives of children. It seems that the real hope of Rakai lies in the many children who are being lifted up from poverty through education and a strong Christian community of support. The intention of the ministry is to educate and help the children grow up with a skill or college education to be re-invested in



the Rakai community. It is a multi-generational ministry that will take years to fully succeed. But in the meantime we saw little glimpses of success!

What has been the impact? Perhaps it would be good for me to share the email I got back from Richard that might further help you understand the meaning of our trip.

Dear Pastor Mark, my brother
Thank you for this email! You can be sure I
have looked at it every day ever since I got it. I
am glad we shared a moment here in Uganda
with your dear wife and the rest of the group.
We were so happy you came over to visit with
us and to see firsthand what God is doing in
Rakai, but also see the 'huge field' ready for
harvesting!

My heart still brings fresh memorable events during the trip but the most outstanding is the dedication of the land and the school. I see well that circle with all people, and God, represented, with the water pouring by your hands. May God continue to guide us on our positions in His work in the near and far future.

I did Skype with Ann this afternoon and God continues to amaze me! 14 more kids sponsored and so much from sales! We are so thankful for our relationship with the Grace family. So many kind hearts!!! We have started roofing the Grace Block - moving closer to that opening. We are trusting God for all the provisions and for each step.

As we consider our Advent journey of preparing for Christmas, I am filled with a sense that God's promise of the Baby Jesus is for everyone! Isn't that great news! And God has invited us here at Grace to be a part of that! Amazing!

Spiritual Formation ~ Pastor Steve

The world can be a noisy place. People yelling at each other. Children screaming for attention. Technology whirling around us at the speed of light. How can we find some silence?

The Psalmist challenges us with these difficult words, "Be still and know that I am God!" (Psalm 46:10)
These words are challenging for two reasons:

- 1. It is hard to be still in our fast-paced world, and
- 2. It seems that the only way that we can actually hear and know God is when we slow down and be still.

So, as your pastor of spiritual formation, my challenge to you for the season of Advent is to find ways to slow down and be still. How do we embrace our Advent theme, "Don't Rush the Promise," this year? Here are some practical suggestions:

- Fast from social media. I have been running a personal experiment for the past month. I deleted my Facebook and Twitter account. Those of you who have followed me on social media in the past know that this is a BIG deal for me. I found that I was becoming enmeshed in the clutter and noise of social media in an unhealthy way.
- ⇒ There are lots of positive aspects of social media, but there are also two aspects that cast a dark shadow. First, people present their best self, their edited self to the world, thus presenting a distorted and caricatured picture. Second, the accessibility of social media promotes lots of SHOUTING, but very little actual listening. Both of these things are counterproductive to the Kingdom of God that Jesus invites us to indwell.
- ⇒ So, give it a try. Cut the cord for a while and see what the silence does to you. I have found a new expansiveness in my soul because of it. Be warned, you will go through withdrawal, but it will be worth it. You don't have to stay away forever, but give it a few weeks.
- Drive the speed limit. I'm being literal here.
 Discipline yourself to drive the exact speed limit on every street. See what happens.
- Set aside at least 5 minutes every day to simply breathe. No devices. No reading. No music. Get into a place where you can be alone and focus on slowly breathing in and breathing out. You may want to say a simple prayer like

- this. When you breathe in, say, "I receive God's grace." When you breathe out, say, "I extend God's grace."
- Notice the details. You've heard the expression "stop and smell the roses." As you go through your hectic day, take moments to stop and notice seemingly insignificant things. Perhaps it is the tiny spider crawling in the corner of your office, or the bird sitting impossibly on the highest bare branch of a tree. Then remind yourself that God cares about all these things.



Vision Board Message

Sometimes it seems like we are so busy that it is hard to slow down and look around. With the hectic, busy lives we lead it is difficult. I must admit, when I am able to slow down for a minute and think about what is going on at Grace, I am amazed. I believe that the Spirit is alive and well here! I say that because I sense God's presence in the midst of what we are doing.

We just concluded a 5 week focus on Stewardship. It was interesting to hear about what it means to be good stewards, to contemplate what it means if we truly believe that it all belongs to God. If our relationships, skills, careers, time, and money all belong to God, and they are all given to us as gifts, what are we supposed to do with them? Are we using them all in a manner that would make God happy? At the conclusion of the series, 95 families said they wanted to take a step in their own personal stewardship journey. That is awesome!

I also see God's Spirit in the missions that are occurring at Grace. I believe that missions are a core piece of our personality and part of what defines us. Sometimes these missions are big and grandiose, like trips to Uganda or Haiti. More often the missions we are involved in generate less noise and fanfare, but are no less important or worthy. I think a good test of a congregation's strength and vitality is, what would happen if it suddenly ceased to exist? Would anyone miss it? Would needs go unmet? I think we pass those tests with flying colors. Our local involvement is impressive. I would encourage anyone who is interested in becoming more involved in serving others and building relationships in order to share the love of Christ to ask the church office how you can get involved. The opportunities are too numerous to list in this short article.

In closing, I just have to say that I am so proud to be able to say that I am a part of the Grace family. I am proud of what we are doing. I am proud of what we stand for. I am blessed to be part of this family that is growing closer to Christ and trying to be like Him. Most of all, I feel so blessed to be able to be on my own spiritual journey with all of you.

- We are excited for the future as we begin to think about celebrating both Grace Lutheran Church's 50th Anniversary in September 2017, and also the 500th Anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation. We hope to incorporate an outreach to our neighbors as a way to say "Thank You" to them, along with working with other churches to further unity in the Love of One Risen Lord.
- As Free2Be Grace ends in 2017, we think ahead to a new campaign for continued debt reduction (our mortgage keeps dropping!), finally dealing with the portables and parking lot and "upgrading" to things such as video cameras to stream services to the ill and homebound.
- Continued outreach to our friends we already serve in Uganda and Haiti.

It is exciting to dream and plan!

Kate Morphew, Grace's Church Administrator, joined the group and the discussion turned to the budget. Kate, with assistance from Beth Clarstrom, has done a wonderful job working towards a budget proposal. The group made great headway as we discussed issues, such as the new overtime law that affects certain key staff members and how to accommodate this into the budget, and overall financially supporting the staff and growing programs, while keeping the budget balanced. The group continues to pray over this matter and will continue the discussion next month. The budget will be presented in January to the congregation at the Congregational Meeting.

The meeting ended in a time of prayer.

Stepping Stone Emergency Housing is the only shelter in Anoka County that accepts single adults experiencing homelessness. This facility, located in the Cronin Building (on former State Hospital grounds), serves over 60 single adults by providing emergency housing and support to youth and adults, 18 years and older. Stepping Stone also provides mentoring and life skills training for the residents, as they strive towards self-sufficiency.


