Leadership—Senior Pastor

"God's Promise for Everyone" seemed like a good "missional" program theme! Reasonable and sensible, it expressed the outward focus of our church. However, living in a rather homogeneous suburb of the Twin Cities, it seemed a bit of a stretch to me, that is until I got off the plane in Uganda and began to connect with our African Children Today partners, Richard Mutaawe and Johnson Lwondo. Their enthusiasm and passion to embody God's promise of love was exciting! But, it wasn't until I met Henry our sponsored child, visited the water tanks and the Amazing Grace Bakery we had constructed, served FMSC food at a Muslim School and then passed out the 70 plus gifts we had brought to the Grace-sponsored children, then I suddenly understood the theme: "God's Promise for Everyone" in a different way! Suddenly I could see the spiritual bridge of God's Promise stretching all the way from suburban streets of Andover, Minnesota to the small dusty paths in Rakai, Uganda.



Worship

I am thankful for our inspiring and biblically based worship. I believe the different styles and service times, combined with well planned and executed liturgies give us many opportunities to deepen our connection with God as well as each other. We work hard at creating inspiring and life-related worship! But we couldn't do this without ALL those who sing, read scriptures, serve communion, usher, staff the audio visional equipment, create stunning decorations, and prepare communion! I am constantly amazed at the large number of people who work so diligently to bring God's Promise into our worship services.

Attendance

I am thankful that worship attendance has started to slowly grow again. Last fall, I asked Johnna Hirt, Director of Research, Evaluation, and Testing of the Anoka-Hennepin District 11, to conduct an informal study of our attendance records for the past five years. It was interesting to learn that although our overall attendance has declined, some of our services (8 & 9) have remained steady or experienced a bit of growth. The informal study revealed what we already knew: the 10:30 service had declined in attendance. At Vision Board we discussed possible reasons why this had occurred:

- More Sunday morning competition on weekends with sports and community events. One solution the Vision Board has considered is an additional Wednesday Evening Worship Service (not to replace any of the other services) to begin in the Fall of 2018 in conjunction with our existing children and catechism activities.
- Changing worship frequency Americans in general are worshipping less often.
- Service Times we shifted the time of the 10:30 service by 10 minutes several years ago. The normal 70 minute service now stretches past 11:30am and may give a psychological feel of being "too long" as it regularly ends past 11:30.
- Changing demographics. We do not have as many young families who are looking for Sunday School ministries.

Leadership—Senior Pastor Con't.

 Contemporary music services need a strong band to lead effectively. The Vision Board recently allocated funds to hire musicians to supplement our band volunteers and sound technicians. Already you can hear the difference!

Connection

GRACELINK

It is more than a year since we introduced our cloudbased GraceLink software that has insignificantly grown our ability to connect with each other. We now are able to provide everyone with easy access to addresses, phone numbers, and email for those who call Grace their spiritual home. In addition, GraceLink has offered people an easy to contribute online even though they are not able to attend regularly.

PASTORAL CARE

I am thankful for the 11 volunteers who are part of our expanding ministry to visit and bring communion to our 25 shut-ins. These men and women extend the caring arms of Jesus to those who may feel disconnected from regular involvement at our church.

We have seen significantly spiritual growth in giving as many people have taken steps of generosity. Please look at some recent statistics in the chart below:

Some initial findings:

- There is a significant number of those who have increased their giving;
- Contributions to Free 2B GRACE has decreased.
 This may be for several reasons:

- The difficult of maintaining a 5 year pledge as people move and/or lose interest. This is normal!
- People have completed their pledge.

Impact of tithing – I cannot emphasize enough how our church's decision to tithe 10% on our offerings has impacted us!

We are thankful that with the combination of giving to the Capital Fund AND Free 2B GRACE we continue to give an extra \$5,000/month to lower our debt.

Staff Changes

The single biggest impact to a church is often staff transition. When a pastor or staff member resigns, retires, or moves to another church, there can be a significant and long-lasting consequence to the ministry they managed. In addition, important

Mission

I am personally thrilled to see our growth in mission as we sent my son, Kurt Hellmann to Cambodia as part of the ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission program. Each year our denomination sends more than 85 young adult to countries all over the world to serve and interact with all kinds of cultures, religions, and mission opportunities. From the Skype conversations I have had with Kurt and following his blog: Accompaniment in Cambodia — www.keepingwithkurt.wordpress.com I can tell you that he has been transformed by his experiences. In addition, he now plans to come home in August and work for the ELCA's Financial Campaign to raise \$200,000,000 for Global Missions.

What also excites me is that another one of our recent college graduates, Nikki Wahl has been accepted by the same YAGM program and will serve next year in Mexico. Our ministry of Grace in the heart of Andover and beyond is certainly happening through the lives of some of our young adults!

By proceeding carefully, prayerfully, and with discernment we hope to emerge from these changes refocused, reinvigorated and recharged.

Possibly the most exciting thing about the past year was the addition of our Summer Stretch program! 50 middle school students spend every Thursday in the summer exploring how God's promise is alive and well in our community. 12 high school students lead as Junior Leaders and helped mentor the younger students. Deep friendships were formed that carried into the school year!


High School

Own Your Faith



OYF is designed to give high school freshmen one additional year following catechism to process their faith questions with an individual mentor in preparation for Confirmation. Thirty-Four students worked diligently with their mentors in a monthly one-on-one sessions throughout the school year. Students participated by watching a monthly video that allowed the students and mentors to interact with the topics and questions in their own time and space. The discussions were rich and both the students and the mentors about God's promise and their faith. The year ended with a wonderful weekend celebrating Confirmation.

High School Ministry



We added a new ministry to High School Ministry this year! Each week during the second half of the school year 11th and 12th grade students met to talk about faith, the Bible, God, and the future. We explored topics pertaining to God's role in their lives and delved into the Bible for deeper understanding of God's word. As high school upper classmen students spend time in prayer for God's promise of hope for their future.

High School students at Grace also can be found meeting in small group Bible Studies, taking adult education classes, serving as ushers, lending their musical talents, and fostering the faith of younger

students as Sunday School and Rockin' Kids Club leaders, nursery workers, and VBS leaders. They are a wonderful asset to our church and we are so blessed to have such a wonderful group of young people in our midst.

Special Events

Once again our mission trip master, Tom Baker, coordinated two amazing mission trips our middle school and our high school students to better understand the diverse issues of rural communities across the US. First, 16 middle school students and 3 adults journeyed to Sisseton, South Dakota to meet and serve our Native American neighbors. In July 15 high school students and 3 adult leaders traveled to Hamlin West Virginia.

In both locations we worked on peoples homes by painting, doing yard work, and light home repairs. We also formed relationships with community members by planning and leading a week long day camp known as "Kids Club" and visiting with members of a local senior citizens community. We were welcomed with open arms in both communities. Both mission teams experienced deep spiritual, emotional, and relational growth. A heartfelt thank you to the staff,

parents, and congregational members who lent their time, talent, and finances to make these two memorable trips a reality.


