How did we do in 2017?

2017 was a year of celebration and change. When the staff, Vision Board, and lay leaders started budgeting for the year, we began by asking ourselves, õwhat is God calling us to do and what parameters have we set to help make these goals possibleö?

Administrative goals included preparing for our annual audit in early 2018, continuing to pay down the mortgage, purchasing an adequate backup system for our server, and continuing to support the congregation and the staff using our integrated database software.

Outreach and benevolence goals included continuing to tithe 10% on our Free 2B and current offerings. We also wanted to continue Godøs Work, Our Hands Day, and Sole Hope, as well as find lay people to help coordinate our outreach ministry teams.

Property needs included forming a team of people to help explore the needs and possibilities, with the permits on our portable buildings expiring in December of 2019.

Spiritual Growth and large church goals included providing menøs and womenøs overnight retreats, support for womenøs events like WOW and the Great Escape, offering of a monthly prayer gathering and adult education classes, as well as our annual Octoberfest fellowship event, and celebrating Graceøs 50 years and the 500th Anniversary of the reformation.

Youth and Family goals included continued support for events like Summer Stretch, VBS, Summer Music Camp, mission trips, and Senior High Youth Group. Another goal

was to provide support to the volunteers who help develop the faith of our youth and children.

Staffing goals shifted as we celebrated and said good bye to Pastor Gene, Pastor Steve, Kim DeVries, Co-Director of Children& Ministries, and Pastor Mark and Jeannie, Director of Outreach and Women& Ministries. We hired Pastor Hahn to be a preaching/ Visitation Pastor. We made the decision to wait on hiring a new

Associate Pastor until we have called a new full time Senior Pastor. In April, we hired a supplemental band to support and help build the 5:00pm and 10:30am Worship Services. We also restructured Children& Ministries after Monica Allen stepped down as Co-Director of Children& Ministries to take a full time position outside of Grace. Monica did agree to stay on the Grace staff until the end of the 2017-2018 program year, as the Rockinø Kids Bible Club Coordinator. We hired Kristin Lowe as our new part time Director of Children& Ministries in August and Annie Fitzl, Director of Nursery and Preschool Ministries, in January. With Pastor Mark stepping back from the accompanist area, we hired an accompanist, Justin Cook, to play for the choir in September. In late November, we welcomed Bridge Interim, Sara Vanderpan.

We publicized and interviewed for the Director of Outreach Ministries position, but decided to hold off on hiring until our Interim Senior Pastor arrived in January, to fill that position.

We met many of the goals we had set for 2017 and we were flexi-

ble during the year, as we had to say good bye to many beloved staff members, and welcomed new.

Grace Lutheran Church continues to be blessed by the generosity of the congregation and the stirring of the Holy Spirit. We had some challenges in 2017, like a leaky roof over the Children® Ministry closet and lots of uncertainty with the many staff changes, however, we were able to pay all of our bills each month and did not have to borrow money from our Thrivent savings accounts at all during the summer, which is a

first for us. This happened thanks to more consistent giving by our congregation, as well as funds from the Donald and Maureen Olson Charitable Trust distribution we began receiving in 2017. We are so grateful for the love, support and financial gifts we received from our Grace congregation and that we came in under budget on expenses, and finished 2017 in a strong financial position.


The vote tally was as follows:

How did we receive income in 2017?






Looking Ahead

What are we planning for 2018?

We plan to welcome Interim Senior Pastor Bruce Arnevik as our leader during Transition. Pastor Bruce will help guild our congregation through the interim process. It is our plan to keep you informed about this process.

Administrative Goals include working with staff to keep the congregation informed of upcoming events and ways to connect. We also plan to care for the congregation and those in need. Upcoming projects include implementing a new server and updating to Microsoft 360. We also plan to have a procedures audit. We will receive on what the audit suggests and make the appropriate changes in our procedures.

Outreach and benevolence goals include continuing to support our outreach teams and provide local and global opportunities to serve. We hope to participate in Godøs Work Our Hands Day in September of 2018. We also plan to continue to tithe 10% of our current and Free2Be offerings.

Property goals include continuing to identify building issues and work within the budget to fix and plan accordingly. We plan on working with an architectural company to evaluate how we can add onto the building and what it will cost if we choose to add on. We will work to start transitioning from florescent tubing to LED lighting in the offices and classrooms. We also will have an electronic control put on the sprinklers for better use of water. We are also exploring how we can fix the parking lot.



Our Worship and Music Departments will continue to build, refine and renew our repertoire of songs for the Contemporary services and expand the utilization of our accompanist, Justin Cook. In all services, the department hopes to add opportunities for people to be involved serving in worship and music.

Spiritual Growth and large church plans include opportunities to grow in faith by offering classes, small group learning, and monthly prayer gatherings. We are also planning to have both a menøs and womenøs overnight retreat. We will support the SALT (Seek, Abide, Love, Trust) team as the prayer and adult education ministry team of Grace. We plan to continue having Connection Sundays.

Youth goals include increasing the high school connection and involvement at church, evaluate and observe the OYF program and determine if changes should be made for the 2018-2019 program year and continue to build a strong and more inclusive Catechism program. Youth Ministry will be intentional about Pastoral Care for youth, families, and volunteers.

Children¢s Ministry will welcome growth and change. The team will develop and build relationships with God and families by having a variety of special activities alongside VBS and SONday school.

Staffing goals include hiring an Outreach Director and supporting Interim Senior Pastor, Bruce Arnevik as he works with the congregation during the call process. Another goal is to provide opportunities for staff development, on site and off.

2018 will be an exciting year for the congregation as we discuss what to do as the Free 2B campaign comes to an end, and what to do with the portable classrooms. (See How Did We Do on Page 6)
