# From Pastor Bruce

### **Transition Team Formed!**

I wrote in the April Grace Notes, We'll wait to announce the names of those on the team until we have the full slate of eight members, which should be in the next week or so. We plan to hold our first meeting in the first part of April, just after Easter. I clearly got that wrong. There's been a delay in filling this slate of team members due to receiving some "no" responses from individuals I'd asked to serve. I was honest with them in the time demands this work will require. And as interested as they may have been in serving, they were honest with me in how this was not a good time for them to serve for personal and family-related reasons. It's all understandable and all good. But since I've said we'll try to make our way through this interim time at a pace that emerges for the congregation, without trying to either artificially speed things up or slow things down, just know this delay wasn't intentional! (And since I said we'll start in the spring and it seems winter has just ended, perhaps we're right on schedule.

The good news is that this team is now in place. The eight members are: Lori Ackerson, Chuck Donaldson, Kevin Gast, Johnna Rohmer-Hirt, Nancy Jenkins, Ann Lange, Sue Melody, and Mike Seide. The team has a good demographic mix of age, gender, recent vs. longtime membership, and worship service normally attended (5:00, 8:00, 9:00, or 10:30). I'll be the 9th member of this team as I work closely with them in my role as pastoral advisor and consultant.

I'm eager to begin our work together. There's lots to explore and consider regarding the current demographics of the surrounding community, the future trajectory of Grace, and the skill set needed for Grace's new pastor. Congregational input will be an important part of the Transition Team's work, so stay tuned. And, as I said last month, please pray for this team and process. I believe it will be an important investment of our time and energy.

# Vision Board Update

Even with the challenges of our Minnesota winter "hanging on" too long, we feel a strong anticipation of springtime. Our Easter celebration and the resurrection of our Lord, are too, a reminder of God's love and desire for renewal in our daily lives.

At Grace, the transition toward a new Senior Pastor is entering it's spring as well. We are in the process of forming a Transition Team to begin the work of assessing our congregation's strengths and needs, with a focus on the future, and what God has in store for us. It is refreshing to take a renewed look at our congregation as we move toward the call of a Senior Pastor. We will be reaching out to congregation members and providing opportunities to give input during this process. We invite and encourage congregation members to get involved, as your perspectives are important and valuable to determining where God is leading us next. The Transition Team will work with Pastor Bruce to lead our congregation through a time of discerning three questions:

Who are we? What is God calling us to do? Who are our neighbors?

We will also examine our heritage, leadership practices and the connections Grace has established outside of our four walls.

Once this renewed assessment is complete, we will be ready to establish a Call Committee to begin the call of a new Senior Pastor for Grace. It is a time of anticipation and excitement as we prayerfully plan for the future.

During a renewal process, as well as any time in our lives, we can always hold steadfast in these words from Hebrews 13:8: *Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.*

# Vision Board Message



"Change." That's a word that either inspires or scares us. This word can be used as a **noun** ("the act or instance of making or becoming different") or a **verb** ("make or become different, take or use another instead of") I think a big part of how you determine your feelings toward the word is how the change occurs. If YOU choose to change your diet in order to improve your health, "change" is probably positive. On the other hand, if SOMEONE ELSE makes the decision about your job description, the word "change" probably is pretty negative. Imposed change is almost always opposed change.

Grace Lutheran has gone through some changes in the last several years. We have had a turnover in staff. We have lost and gained pastors, ministry directors, and support staff. We have had a change in attendance. We have lost and gained members. We have launched several outreach opportunities (Rakai, Haiti, Stepping Stones, Sand Creek School, Feed My Starving Children, Hope 4 Youth, Eagle's Nest, DivorceCare, GriefShare, Pastoral Care, Grace Quilters, GRAMPS, Our Savior's, Family Promise, Family Table, etc.) Some opportunities are still being maintained, while others are not because things have changed. Our congregation has changed and their needs have changed. Depending how these changes have impacted your own life, the changes may be positive or negative.

"Change" is recorded several times in the Bible, both in verses and in accounts. Some include Jesus changing water into wine. Moses was able to change the water of the Red Sea. Disciples changed their lives to follow Jesus. Kings were able to change the behavior of their constituents. Locations were changed. People's names were changed.

In June as I change my identity from a Vision Board member to not being a Vision Board member, I know there will be changes coming my way. I won't be a part of the group who helps with decisions of change regarding future pastoral staff. I won't be involved in the change to the outside of the church building (portables and parking lot.) Nor will I be a part of the group who makes decisions about changes I can't even imagine.

With the future of Grace in ever changing hands, please be receptive to changes. Some may be to your liking, and some may not. The word of God is unchanging, as is his plan. He will be with us as we experience change at Grace. Be a part of the positive future of our church!



# What is Just 1 More Step?

A FUN 10K run, 5K run/walk and a kids run! Filled with live entertainment and a beautiful wooded course with rolling hills. The 5K and 10K are chip timed to ensure runners will receive accurate race times.

All proceeds from the event go to a non-profit providing services in Haiti, World Wide Village. So far in our first three races, we have raised over \$30,000 that has been used to improve lives of people in Haiti. With the help of race proceeds World Wide Village has built a medical clinic, dug wells to provide clean water to a village, set up agriculture programs and began work on a technical school. Proceeds from this year's race will go to purchase solar panels to provide electricity to past and future projects.

Grace Lutheran Church is proud to partner with World Wide Village to direct this race. This years race proceeds will go to Haiti, City on a Hill project. Our partnership with World Wide Village enables us to ensure funds raised are truly going to equip and support Haitian communities. World Wide Village is a Christian non-profit organization working primarily in Williamson and Luly, Haiti since 2006.
