Reflections from an Unstable Pastor!

When I recently met with one of Grace's ministry teams, someone in the group said "when we get our stable pastor", referring to when Grace eventually calls its new pastor. I've wasted no time in claiming my new title as "unstable pastor"!

While there are advantages to being a "stable", "settled", or "permanent" pastor (and remember that once upon a time I served a congregation for 20 years), there are also advantages to being "unstable". As the Alban Institute has pointed out, during interim times congregations tend to become unstuck and free to look at themselves – their identity, mission, and future – in new and fresh ways. My perception is that this is beginning to happen at Grace. Correct me if I'm wrong, but I feel Grace is weathering relatively well with the staff losses and transitions of 2017 and relaxing into this interim time. And it seems there is an openness and hopefulness for the future.

I'm impressed with the Transition Team and the work they are about. I'm amazed at how many people at Grace completed the ELCA Congregational Vitality Survey at the urging of the Transition Team. And I hope that you will respond in similar fashion when the Transition Team invites everyone to complete another survey in the coming weeks which the Transition Team is developing. This survey will be homegrown with Grace-specific questions, including questions about the skills and leadership qualities needed in your next senior pastor.

As I've said, we want to make our way through this interim time at a pace that emerges for the congregation, without trying to either artificially speed things up or slow things down. With the Transition Team currently setting the pace, I think (continued on next page)

this is the case. On Sunday, September 30, and Wednesday, October 3, the Transition Team will offer congregational gatherings to present information they've gathered (including survey results) and to listen to your perspectives on Grace and what you're looking for in your new "stable senior pastor"!

As I write this on July 11, I know that plenty of summer remains. But since this newsletter already reaches into September, I foresee a fall at Grace that's full of rich experiences in worship, education for all ages, and mission opportunities to serve our neighbors. And the Transition Team will continue to move us forward this fall as they write their final report following their conversations with the congregation. Your prayers and your participation are needed. I believe the Holy Spirit is at work in and through this (unstable) time together!

Transition Team Update

Transition is an important aspect in many different settings and can sometimes be seen as a component that can either help or hinder a situation. Transitions in the educational world can symbolize smooth or problematic classroom management that can improve or discourage learning. Transitions in the arts, such as a dance sequence, a musical piece or even a theatrical performance can enhance or deter from the experience of the audience. Transitions in a church setting can have the similar, potentially beneficial or not-so-beneficial effects, depending on how they are approached.

During our transition time, we are fortunate to have the gift of time and leadership, through both Pastor Bruce and Pastor Hahn; the Transition Team working on behalf of the congregation and Vision Board; and the Synod. The time we are taking to transition is allowing us to engage in a process of determining who we are as a congregation, who God is calling us to be in the next phase of our journey as a place of Grace in the heart of Andover and beyond, and identify the qualities and characteristics in our next Senior Pastor that will most effectively walk with us and challenge us to be who we are called to be.

The Grace Transition Team has been meeting twice a month since the end of April and is currently planning to finalize our work in a culminating report to the Vision Board, the call committee that will be convened in the coming months, and the congregation by late fall or early winter. As part of the work we have done so far and are planning to do, we have reviewed the Focus 20/20 report and other historical information as a way to ground us in who we have been and what has brought us to where we are. In June, both in worship services and online, we conducted a congregational vitality survey to provide us input as to who we are, currently. We are also digging into information about our community to learn more about the people that live in the area surrounding our physical location as well as their experiences and perspectives. (Watch for the overview of the vitality survey results to be shared later this summer when they become available.)

We are so truly grateful for your input and prayers for the Transition Team and the congregation as a whole as we process through this critical time in our story. Each of us plays a vital role in discerning and doing God's will as we take the next steps in His plan for us. We look forward to our continued work together!

Transition Team Presentations and Listening Sessions

As part of the process of calling a new senior pastor, the Transition Team will hold meetings to present a summary of the congregational survey results along with key demographic information and trends identified in our area. The Transition Team seeks to define who we are as a church, who is our neighbor and what attributes we need in a senior pastor. The sessions will include time for feedback from and discussion among attendees.

The sessions will be held on Sunday, Sept 30 and Wednesday, October 3. The meeting times and Grace room locations have yet to be determined but it is anticipated that the sessions will be approximately an hour in length. The agenda and presentations will be the same on both dates so attendees need to attend only one session.

What is going on with our "holy" parking lot? (See page 10 for details)


I heard that the portables at Grace need to be removed. Is this true?

A few weeks ago an old friend of mine sent me this story.

Two young brothers had the reputation of being the cause of most of the trouble in their small town. Their mother was beside herself, not knowing what to do. She brought her problem to a local pastor who was known to be very good at solving these kinds of problems. It was decided he would counsel the boys individually starting with the youngest.

On the first day of counseling, the pastor looked at the younger brother and asked "Where is God"? The young boy's mouth dropped open, he couldn't speak. The pastor asked him again "Do You know where God is"? Again the young boy could not answer; instead he jumped up, ran home and hid in the back of his closet.

When the older brother came home he began looking for his younger brother and found him still hiding in the back of his closet. "What happened", he asked? His young brother responded, "We're in big trouble this time. God is missing and they think we did it".

I had a good chuckle over this cute story. Then the horror of it struck me. What if it were true? After all, whenever you read a paper or listen to the news, our senses are assaulted with stories of beatings, stabbings and shootings. Children are being forcibly removed from their parents.

Countries who have been close allies are squabbling over trade agreements, nuclear proliferation and strips of land that holds no interest to anyone else.

This past week, Judy and I have been following the story about the soccer team trapped in the flooded cave in Thailand. This morning it was reported that all twelve boys and their coach were rescued.

A month ago I was privileged to provide security for VBS. It was controlled chaos, but very uplifting. - Youth Helpers are a blessing to the teachers of our younger children. If you had fun helping at VBS, please consider being a Youth Helper.



A Global Perspective on Missions


Wednesdays, beginning Oct 3. 6:30-8pm

Parking Lot Updates

Many of you have been asking, what is being done about the parking lot? Before I can answer that question. I need to explain the series of events, in order, that must be taken place



- 1) We are replacing the parking lot lights with new energy efficient LED
 - lighting. The existing wooden poles have deteriorated and have become unsafe. The existing high pressure sodium lamps are costly to operate and not environmentally friendly.
- 2) Our asphalt company will patch the pot holes. If you have recently lost your car in the huge hole by the garage, we will have them watch for it. Once the lot is patched the GRAMPS team will stripe the lot. We anticipate this work to be completed this summer.
- 3) I am sure most of you have heard the portables will need to be removed by the end of 2019. Our construction team is working with Kinghorn Construction to create a suitable replacement for the space lost by the removal of the portables.
- 4) After the demolition and construction projects are finished, we will have the parking lot milled and overlay applied. This will give us a new parking lot that should last for another 20 years.

ATTN: Thrivent Members

Did you know that you can be a part of a Thrivent Action Team to help someone in need or raise awareness for a cause? Think about an unmet need in your church or community and how you could help. Apply to lead your volunteer team in a one-time fundraiser, service activity or educational event that can be completed within 90 days. Once your project is approved, you'll receive a Thrivent Action Kit, including a promotional banner, invitations and thank-you cards, Thrivent Action Team T-shirts (up to 25 in a variety of sizes), a \$250 Community Impact Card you can use as seed money to get your project off the ground and make a bigger impact.

Wondering how often are you eligible? All Thrivent members are eligible to lead a Thrivent Action Team, however, the number of teams each member can lead per year depends on his or her membership type. Benefit members (those that hold are eligible to lead two Thrivent Action Teams per calendar year, and associate members are eligible to lead one per calendar year (maximum of three).

If you would be willing to create an Action Team for an event that is happening at Grace, please contact the church office. It is not uncommon with the Senior Pastor leaving to see contributions dip. The congregation and staff are doing a great job keeping expenses down. The past two years, we have finished the budgetary year with a surplus. This surplus helps us pay our bills and meet our financial obligations during the summer, when our contributions are typically less.

It is also time for us to start thinking about 2019. We will begin putting together our 2019 budget soon. Please be thinking about your ministry teams and what funds they may need in 2019.
