#### Vision Board Minutes

The January Vision Board meeting was held at Grace on Tuesday, January 15, at 6pm.

The minutes for the December 2018 meeting were approved as submitted.

The Call Committee has finished the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) and sent onto Bishop Ann Svennungsen who met with the congregation on 1/20/19 for face-to-face conversations regarding our wants and needs in a new Senior Pastor and what our church could offer to the new Senior Pastor.

Grace's request to extend our Interim Use Permit is now on the agenda of the Planning/Zoning Committee meeting for Feb 12, 2019.

The Forgiveness Project's "The F Word" exhibit will be brought to Grace from March 9-17th displaying banners sharing powerful stories of forgiveness. The exhibit will be open to our larger community. Pastor Bruce will join the mission trip to Haiti from March 1-8th. He's also reaching out to parishioners to share parts of their faith stories for mid-week Lenten services.

Pastor Bruce prepared his Financial Annual Report. Overall, pleased with the end of the year figures. Our monthly financial statements were reviewed. Grace finished the year in the black with generous year-end gifts and a combination of reduced expenses and regular giving. Our mortgage was paid down by almost \$80,000.00 this year. The congregation will vote on Free2B tithing distributions, and the Vision Board will choose where to distribute the remaining benevolence.

The 2019 budget was reviewed with notations made for the \$30,000 increase in "Current Offerings" based on the commitment cards received from parishioners during the Stewardship focus and a change in salaries/benefits with a new Senior Pastor starting September 1, 2019. The budget was approved unanimously by the Vision Board. The congregational vote on the weekend of 1/26 – 1/27/19.

The meeting closed in prayer. The next meeting of the Vision Board is Tuesday, February 19.

# Updates from Interim Senior Pastor Bruce

Staffing Level Changes: The congregation recently received a letter from me about trimming back staffing levels beginning July 1. This decision was not because "giving is down". Relatively speaking, giving is quite good. Because of the good response to our stewardship appeal last fall, we were able to add an additional \$30,000 to our 2019 budget. That fact, along with the staffing level reductions, allowed us to adopt a balanced budget for 2019. Financially, the situation looks even stronger for 2020.

The staffing level reductions were done to better "right size" Grace's staff relative to the current size of our congregation and to align our total staffing

costs to a more reasonable percentage of our total operating budget. These decisions were difficult and took several months to make. Working with the **Executive Committee** of the Vision Board, I drafted a proposal to trim staffing levels across the board so that no ministry area would be cut too deeply. The Vision Board approved the final proposal in December and the staff was informed in mid-January.

April/May or September/October. I was planning to go on the Haiti trip in March, so now we'll see if that will still work out or not.

Wednesday Lenten Services: As part of our five Wednesday Lenten worship services (not counting Ash Wednesday), I'm again asking five people from the congregation to share part of their personal faith story. Each of our faith journeys is different and we sometimes forget that we Lutherans also have testimonies we need to tell each other! Sharing these stories is one of the ways we can deepen our sense of Christian community with one another.



If you have any questions or concerns about this, I invite you to speak with me, or with someone from the Executive Committee – Scott Christensen, Johnna Rohmer-Hirt, or Vickie Meade. This decision was not about the performance of our staff. They work hard and do a really good job on behalf of Grace. Pray for them as they sort out how these changes will affect their jobs and their incomes after July 1.

**Haiti:** Due to the recent level of civil unrest in Haiti, the Grace2Haiti mission trip scheduled for March 1 - 8 was postponed. It will be re-scheduled either in



# Lent Noisy Offerings

This year's Noisy Offerings collected throughout Lent will benefit the Healthy Mothers, **Healthy Babies** initiative - a new Maternal Health



Program at the newly constructed medical center in Williamson, Haiti.

Being pregnant in Haiti is risky business - especially in rural Haiti where access to maternal care is minimal or non-existent. According to UNICEF, more women die in Haiti before, during or after childbirth than anywhere else in the Western **Hemisphere**. Why? It's heartbreakingly simple: the majority of Haitian women do not have access to or cannot afford maternal health options. Often, women walk for hours ... in labor ... to find help. For some with undiagnosed complications, it's too late. The goal of the **Healthy Mothers**, **Healthy Babies** initiative is to raise \$30,000 which will provide expectant mothers with prenatal vitamins, counseling on proper diet and nutrition, monitoring of blood pressure and other important maternal health factors, and sterile birthing kits for safe deliveries. In addition, funds will provide salaries for nurses to work in the program and transportation costs to ship in donated furnishings and equipment. - 1. Create a *Log in to GraceLink* for yourself. Once you have logged in,
- 2. Click on Giving on the tool bar.
- 3. Have a check or credit card handy.
- 4. Determine the total amount and how often you want to give that amount.
- 5. Then select how much you would like to give to each fund.
- 6. Finish filling out your bank information.
- 7. Then follow the prompts to finish.
