Living with a Generous Spirit

I taught our Golden Rule Daycare kids the parable of the vineyard workers this morning. This is the story where the landowner hires workers at different times during the day, promising to pay the people hired first in the morning a day's wages, and at the end of the day, pays everyone the same, regardless of how long they worked. I thought it would be fun to have the daycare kids act out the story. I had 6 rakes and I hired the kids with the promise that if they worked for me for the day, I would give them 3 stickers. The kids were all eager to volunteer, so I selected my first two, who instantly began vigorously raking the front of our altar space. I explained to the kids who were sitting and watching, that the work is hard and it is hot outside, and I still had plenty of crops in the ground, so I needed to hire more workers. Soon enough



all my rakes were being used and I got to the end of the story. I lined them up- the most recently hired workers in the front, and the first workers in the back. I paid the first kids in line 3 stickers, who received their payment with joy and thanksgiving. When I got to the back of the line- I said, "I just gave everyone else **three** stickers for their work, but you worked much longer and harder how many stickers should I give you?" One little girl with big brown eyes responded quickly: "Two!" I had to laugh. Of course, this hadn't worked the way I planned. "No, you get three too," I told her. Then I asked, "I'm going to give all the kids 3 stickers, even those who didn't work. Is that fair?" The kids were quick to shout out "Yes!" Clearly, the kids missed the punch line. All the daycare workers laughed along with me as I explained to the kids that we have a generous God who gives God's love to us regardless of how hard we work, and what we do. Is God fair? Depends on how you perceive that story, I guess. God is fair enough to love us all and to be generous with all of us. The daycare kids knew this well. They didn't grumble or complain, they were all just grateful for what they had been given and excited that they ALL got three stickers!

Kids know how to live in the kingdom of God better than most adults do. They are less concerned with who did what, for how long, and more concerned with including other people and making sure everyone feels good. Kids understand that everything they have is a gift. After all, they haven't earned anything, but daily they are provided with food, shelter and love (well hopefully). I recognize that some kids don't receive these things, but it is our hope and prayer that every child has this. Now don't get me wrong, I am fully aware that kids are far from perfect. I am raising two daughters. There were plenty of days when my girls were not generous with one another and would have been quick to point out that something wasn't fair. Today, I was pleasantly surprised by the hearts and the kindness of the kids at Golden Rule who showed such a loving generous spirit.


