

Surely God is in this Place

When Jacob wakes up after having slept all night using a rock as a pillow, he proclaims these words: "Surely the Lord is in this place and I did not know it!" (Genesis 28:16). I felt a little like this after our first parking lot worship. I will confess, I was not thrilled about parking lot worship, or even sure how it would go. I also know there were problems with it: people could not see over some of the larger cars, we did not get to have fellowship, the list could go on and on. And yet, there was something beautiful that happened that morning. As the cars streamed in and parked, I heard these words: "It's so good for us to be together again." "It's like coming home." "This is the first time in a long time, that my Sunday felt like Sunday." Parking lot worship might feel a little like sleeping on a rock, compared to a comfy feather pillow and yet God's presence is still with us. I left that Sunday feeling rejuvenated in my faith and thankful for the opportunity to be with those of you who came. God's Spirit, God's love, God's grace is with us in the parking lot.

I find it important to remember that God's first residence was always outside. Abraham, Isaac and Jacob set up altars all over the place in the world, marking places they experienced God's presence. And when King David argues that because he has built a house for himself, he should surely build God a house too, God's response is "I have not lived in a house since the day I brought people up out of Egypt. I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle." God basically says, "I'm okay outside, living among you." (I would argue that clearly, God did not live in Minnesota in the dead of winter, because while I enjoy camping, winter camping is not my thing. Give me a house in the winter!) For now, I am finding delight in worshipping God outside. There is beauty in our gardens. There might even be beauty in our parking lot? There is definitely beauty in all of the people gathered in the parking lot!

The re-open team has been praying and talking about ways for us to connect, recognizing our desire to worship together. We are very grateful for your feedback through our surveys, letting us know how we are meeting your needs, and what other things we can offer that might nourish you in spirit. We continue to take small steps forward and are working to designate plans that will help us to be in church together in a variety of ways.

Our church has always been bigger than a building. It is bigger than our parking lot. It is alive out in the world living in each of you! I am grateful. And yet, the importance of being in church together is not something that is lost on me. From our surveys we learned that that majority of you want to meet in person and about 30% of you are comfortable doing so, only if we are worshipping outside. Some of you are ready to worship inside right now. I want you to know we hear you and understand your desire.

Congregational Meeting



Update from our Special Congregational Meeting on July 12th

Thank you for gathering and joining us for our Special Congregational Meeting. On that Sunday we did two very important things for the life of Grace Lutheran. First, we adopted a new Constitution. This Constitution has been approved by the Synod and follows their guidelines, while also allowing Grace to describe our own practices in electing our Vision Board and various other ways we operate. 106 people voted on the constitution, one person abstained, and 105 people voted in favor. Second, we voted to call Maria Markman to be Associate Pastor of Grace. 105 people voted, one person abstained, and 104 people voted in favor. We are thrilled to have Maria join our staff in her first call to ordained ministry. She will begin her ministry with us in this new role on August 3rd. Both of these votes took place over Zoom and we had a small group of people who gathered and voted in person.

On a personal note, I have known Maria since she was a teenager. It has been such a delight to watch her grow and develop as a person and as a leader in the faith. She is a very gifted person in SO many ways. I am thrilled to have her as a colleague in ministry. I know that God will continue to use Maria to share the Gospel, to reach new people and that Grace will be blessed by her ministry.

Devotional Resources

I use five devotional resources that I would like to share with you. Only one of the five resources will cost money. The first resource I am speaking of is "Jesus Calling" by Sarah Young, which I received as a gift. This is a wonderful daily devotional book written in the first person of Jesus. We know that Jesus is with us every moment of our life and this scripture based devotional really gives you a comfortable feeling. The devotional reminds me daily to put my trust in Jesus.

The next daily devotion I use is "Christ In Our Home". Growing up in a Lutheran home my parents would often use this devotional with my family after our evening dinner. "Christ In Our Home" is available from church in limited supply. I have never had difficulty obtaining this devotional. During this time of COVID-19, contact the church office for a copy. Typically it is available at the Welcome Desk. "Christ In Our Home" is a daily devotional written by members of ELCA churches like Grace Lutheran. It is published quarterly in a small booklet and the devotions are based on the "Revised Common Lectionary Daily Readings". These short devotions are applicable to daily life.

The following two devotions are from online resources and are also daily devotions. The first is "God Pause" www.luthersem.edu/godpause/ written by alumni of Luther Seminary based on the "Revised Common Lectionary Daily Readings". These devotions are short and current.

The other online devotional that I like is from Clergy Stuff www.clergystuff.com/daily-devotions. This devotional is based on the "Narrative Lectionary Daily Readings" which is what Grace has used in the past for a basis for the weeks sermon. There are certain times when the Grace staff decides to deviate from the Narrative Lectionary. The link for this devotional will bring you to a calendar and clicking on the appropriate day will bring you to the devotional.

Last, but not least, is our own Grace Daily Devotion brought to you by our very own Grace Staff. You may find these devotions if you follow Grace on Facebook or on our church website www.grace-andover.org. The link for the devotion is found, as a banner on our opening page. Grace has been blessed with gifted writers on staff.

Music and Worship in the Time of COVID-19

Dear Friends.

As we approach the fall when usually our music ministries are cranking back up, we are surveying and discussing the process and possibility of worshipping in person again, and I'm sure many of you are wondering how it all looks...

I wish I had all the answers - really I do.

But it is a complex and constantly, changing world we live in. Since March, much of my time at work has been spent producing and recording our virtual worship services. It's not been anything like normal! We are very blessed that long before the COVID-19 era, I had recorded a lot of music from our worship services, and that has allowed us to not have to spend as much time producing that part of worship. It has been a gift and blessing to be able to use that content to "help us through".

One of the concepts that has pretty solid scientific evidence is that it is not safe to rehearse and sing together during this time in large groups. I've read a lot of articles on it, and there isn't much disagreement.

So, what do we do to still offer ways for our choir, instrumentalists, praise team or soloists to still participate in worship?

Well, we do remote recording, and I "assemble" it after the fact.

So, in the fall I see us offering different options – if we are worshipping together, it's very likely the only singing will be done by a cantor/leader and maybe the pastors and myself. The cantor might do some special music, or might just lead. We might choose to play special music that's

been pre-recorded (I send the accompaniment to the choir, soloist or praise team, they send back a recording of their voice part, all of that is "reassembled" later). Initially we'd probably do that as audio-only, since putting together a video with several/many participants gets complex. We'd work towards that for in the future.

Frankly, I'm excited to try this, it could mean there are some of you who either haven't been able to participate due to schedules or just never considered being part of a choir, praise team or instrumental group and decide to "give it a try". We might find that in this time it actually allows MORE people to participate!

So, if this sounds like something you might be willing to try, keep your eyes out for an invitation to experiment with us!

As I close, let me tell you how grateful I am for your encouragement, kind words, prayers, and continuing support. We're all in this together, and it means so much to me (and the rest of our staff and pastors) when you share so kindly with us. Those little notes and messages cheering us on are often the "shot in the arm" we need to make it through the week.

What is Normal?

People of Grace,

July 12th, 2020, I was anxiously awaiting news about our future together at Grace. I had just spent the weekend with my cousin and her girlfriend and by the time Sunday rolled around, they knew what I was waiting for. Waiting to hear if I had received the votes required to be called as Grace Lutheran Church's new Associate Pastor of Faith Formation. My position as Director of Children's Ministry began as just that, but quickly and quietly morphed into a nine month interview and visioning process of what we could do together in the name of Christ! And as I anxiously awaited that phone call about "the vote," I wondered if all of you had been interviewing me all that time too, visioning, dreaming, and praying about what we could do if we had more time together. As luck would have it, I was in the other room when my phone rang, with Chad Hadler on the other end calling with some news, he left a message requesting I return his call. This message immediately sent me into a tailspin. I tried to dissect the timbre and tone of his voice, anything that would tell me the outcome he was calling to share. I had no idea! There was only one thing left to do, return his call. As soon as he answered, I knew he had called with good news to share! There was no hiding his excitement, or mine, in that phone call. The phone call that shared that I had received the call as Associate Pastor of Grace Lutheran Church in Andover! And just as I was sure of the good news Chad was calling to share, I was affirmed in my call to continue to share Good News! Not just the news to family and friends, who were also anxiously awaiting this news, but the News I am called to share as a minister of Word and Sacrament affirmed in the ordi-

nation vows I will soon take (August 22nd at 2:00pm on Bockman Hall lawn at Luther Seminary in St. Paul) and made manifest through the teaching of Scripture, creeds, and confessions, in the faithful use of the means of Grace, and through the opportunity to share God's gifts of grace and forgiveness through the sacraments.

I am so grateful to the community of Grace for extending this call to me! I am so excited to begin this work. I have been preparing for since my very own baptism (if you are curious about the story, please ask, I would love to share it with you!). And now during the rest of my time off, as I settle into the idea of my new normal, I reflect on the idea of normalcy. It seems so normal that I am here at this point in my life, starting the career of my dreams, the ministry to which I am called; and yet there is nothing normal about this job. It seems so normal that at almost 30 years old, I would be moving from my parent's home and into a home of my own. And after spending four months in and out of quarantine and stay at home orders, my move seems anything but normal too! And so I think about what God would say about normal. What is normal? And a quick concordance search proves the Bible says very little about normal, in fact, the Bible is way more concerned with antonyms of normal than synonyms. God has a lot to say about transformation, about growth, about reformation, than keeping with the status quo or living a normal life. Recently, I came across a quote by activist and poet Sonya Renee Taylor, she says, "We will not go back to normal. Normal never was. Our pre-corona existence was not normal other than we normalized greed, inequity, exhaustion, depletion, extraction, disconnection, confusion, rage, hoarding, hate, and lack. We should not long return, my friends. We are being given the opportunity to stitch a new garment. One that fits all of humanity." So as we move into this new chapter together, let us be challenged to do the things we have been called to do in new and transformed ways. In some ways, we will have to because our pandemic circumstances require it, starting in a new position or hiring a new associate pastor requires it too! We will experience many challenges together and hopefully we won't fall back on normal to answer those challenges, hopefully we will look toward our fully present, ever loving, transformational God to be our guide!

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect" Romans 12:2.



Because the program this summer will look different than in years past, we wanted to change the name to reflect the new camp. Our theme is still **Go! Make Disciples!** We will study Matthew 28:19-20, which we will lean into this great commission given by Jesus to his disciples even if "going" looks a little different right now.

This new *Summer Evening Bible Camp* is for kids ages 5 years old thru 5th grade. This year the camp will be held **2 WAYS** - virtually with supplies for crafts and games available for pick up at church. Together we are living, learning, growing and experiencing GRACE! Children's ministry at Grace is quite possibly at the heart of this transition. Things already look different, because living through a pandemic requires us to do things a little differently. In addition to pandemic adjustments, Grace has decided not to hire for the position of Children's Ministry Director. Although this is the case, our Children's Ministry Team and volunteers with Pastor Maria's leadership will continue to accentuate our commitment to the families of Grace and faith formation. We will continue to work together to provide meaningful faith practices and programs for your children and families. With COVID-19 still a reality, all our plans for Fall 2020 are tentative and subject to change as pandemic protocols change. Thank you for your patience and attention while we navigate this time together gracefully. So what will this look like? What's new?

Children's Ministry Emails

Most important at this time might be, how are you staying connected? How are you getting your Grace information? As details of events, activities, and worship change weekly, if not daily, make sure you are staying connected. If you are not receiving Children's Ministry emails (SONday School and devotional content as well as information on events and activities) and would like to receive them, please email Mariam@graceandover.org and we will add you to our email list.

SONday School

As soon as it is safe to do so, we will return to weekly SONday School during worship on Sunday mornings at 8:45 and 10:30. Children will begin in worship with their families before being dismissed to their classrooms after the children's message.

We will continue to use the "Bloom!" in faith curriculum. This curriculum is designed by an ELCA pastor to follow the narrative lectionary. This ensures families, whether in church or at SONday School, are learning the same lessons. We know that faith grows when it is nurtured at home, because families will have common language about these stories of our faith, we hope you will be able to talk about your faith together at home.

Kids Night Out

Like with SONday School, as soon as it is safe to do so, we will return to Wednesday night kids and family programing. Each Wednesday evening starting as early as September 23rd (Pandemic protocols permitting) we will begin the night with Family Pizza. Come enjoy some pizza for \$1.50 a slice, and fellowship with other Grace families. Then Catechism students (6-8 graders) will be released to their programming at 6:30 pm while children kindergarten through 5th grade will stay in the fellowship hall for their own faith formation programming. All levels will be released at 7:45 PM. In line with Pastor Maria's call to Grace as Associate Pastor of Faith Formation (for all ages at Grace), we are experimenting with ways to include family learning opportunities, service projects, intergenerational events, and more. 



Grace4Rakai **Update** By Scott Christensen

Many of you have been asking how the people in Rakai, Uganda have been doing during this global pandemic. Uganda has had only 1,000+ confirmed cases and relatively few deaths. The borders to neighboring countries are

closed, and Rakai remains in lock down. Schools and markets are closed and people are confined to their homes. Hunger remains a **HUGE** concern and people have died from malaria and health issues due to the fact that there is no access to medical care.

Through the generous donations of so many, African Children Today (ACT) has been able to provide food boxes to more than 3,000 families in Rakai during the pandemic. Food boxes contain rice, beans and maize flour (which is milled at the new mill in Rakai), and each box feeds a family of 8 for an entire month! Many lives have been saved during this pandemic through the generous support of Grace members who have funded food boxes. Never underestimate what your dollars - and God's Spirit - can do!

Although schools remain closed, teachers continue to be paid their salaries. Teachers have been doing their best to support students with school packets delivered to their homes. ACT believes that when students are able to return to school, it will be important that they be placed with the same teachers they had before the pandemic.

Despite challenging circumstances, construction has begun on a new ACT High School that will be located right next to the ACT Junior School. (Thankfully, the Ugandan government is allowing outdoor construction projects like this to proceed.) The new high school will serve children ages 12 to 18 and will offer classes in the sciences, mathematics, and other subjects to prepare young people for teacher's colleges, careers and other vocations. The workers are living on site and are provided much needed income during this difficult time for their families. ACT dreams that the school may be able to open with a few classes in 2021.


