

Building Grace

"For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God— not the result of works, so that no one may boast." Ephesians 2:8

Grace is a gift from God. A gift freely given to all of us, without work, without merit, without anything. It is out of this world.

I will admit at times that running a church and being a pastor is a lot of work! And truthfully people want to measure our success. How many people attend your church? How much money do we have? How many new people are we reaching? These questions are important! I ask them myself because they are essential to how we do things: how we pay the bills and support the ministries here in this place. And yet, they are not grace-filled questions. They are worldly questions. Questions of merit, questions of work, questions of doing. We in the church can often be quick to boast (although somewhat humbly). This is what we are doing. Our parking lot was full on Easter.... Or we have grown during the pandemic.

As I look to this fall, I know that the staff has put a lot of energy into planning ministry. I also know our volunteers are ready to go and kick off important things like our WOW Bible Study, and small groups on many different nights of the week. These are all ways that we experience grace, and also build grace - not by our own works of course, but by sharing God's love and grace with others.

I am so excited about the new sign that is now on our property. A sign of grace where we get to share not only the activities happening here at our building, but also words of encouragement, and words of hope for a world that is desperately seeking them.

Our sign is one of the steps in "building grace" (Thanks to Pastor Maria Markman for this title), but there are many more in our future. As you know, our property on Nightingale was sold this year and we will be signing on the dotted line on September 8th. We will be using most of this money to renovate our building to do the necessary things we need, like fixing our bathrooms and securing our daycare, but there are some other things too. As our team has met with the Busch Architects over this past year, their company has listened to our hopes and dreams. Recognizing that we long for a space that facilitates connection and care by expanding our narthex. We also long to be able to have a large food pantry to serve our neighbors, to update our sanctuary and have more light, while also doing the necessary upkeep of fixing our parking lot and more. The reality is that all of this will cost money that will go beyond what we made on the sale of the land. And yet, investing in our ministry is one of the ways that we will build grace, not only our church, but also share God's love, God's forgiveness, and God's story of acceptance.

Jesus, throughout the book of John (the Gospel we will be reading this year) often uses signs to point out to people ways in which God's grace is experienced. Maybe it's in the flowing of wine at a wedding, or in the feeding of thousands after a long lecture, but he also says, the signs are pointing to something more. They are a symbol of God at work in and through those signs. This is the same for us. While our building renovations might seem like construction, the truth is they are a way for God to use us, and to show God's amazing presences and love on the corner of Round Lake Blvd. and Bunker. What I know to be true, is that people are longing for just a little bit of love, a little bit of comfort, a little bit of acceptance and a whole lot of grace. Let's let God lead us in building Grace together!

Our Thirsty World

This week, I opened "Boundless: Stories of Christ's Abounding Love and Grace," a magazine published by the ELCA for supporters of ELCA ministries around the world. The opening letter from Kathy Summers (an ELCA development executive) begins with a verse from Hosea:

"Let us acknowledge the Lord; let us press on to acknowledge him. As surely as the sun rises, he will appear; he will come to us like the winter rains, like the spring rains that water the earth." Hosea 6:3

Instantly, I began to reflect on how thirsty our world is. The earth is literally parched. We see evidence of this as fires rage and waters in lakes and rivers and streams recede and even dissipate. Walking this past week by the Rum River, a woman passing lamented about the stunted corn growth. She literally proclaimed to me as I walked by, "let us pray for the corn!" Yes, let us pray for the corn. How might we also adjust the ways we live to leave our world healthier and quenched?

We humans also thirst. Kathy writes in her article, "The last couple of years have been defined by turmoil, uncertainty, and grief. Even now as more and more of our world opens up, many are still struggling."

I have heard this cry of thirst from many of you and I join in this cry. At the same time, I know these words of Hosea to be true -He will appear! Do you hear Hosea's call to acknowledge the Lord? Surely, God has shown up for you in difficult times. Surely, God has watered you to grow you into the person you are today. As you reflect on this passage, what are you thirsting for?

Whether you are thirsting for connection, wisdom, certainty, excitement, growth, health, peace, love, grace, or something else entirely, let us acknowledge the Lord, who is the giver of all things! Hold fast to the promise that God appears and provides for us living waters. Together let us pray for fall and for all of the new beginnings fall brings:

Thirst-quenching God, we pray as seasons change that you might remind us of your provision for life. For all of those who are feeling the anxiety of newness on the horizon, may they experience your preparedness, comfort, and peace. As the new school year begins we pray for teachers and administrators, parents, and students may all be patient and eager to learn. May our acknowledgement of you transform how we live, move, breathe, and serve in this world. Help us show up for the thirsty in our midst and drench them with your love. Amen.




"The Zoomies"



Have you ever wondered what God is really like? There are so many stories in the Bible about




"(Don't) Call Me Crazy" Mondays 6:30 to 8pm


Green Ribbon





Wednesday Evenings at Grace


