

Curiosity

²There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire out of a bush; he looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed.³Then Moses said, "I must turn aside and look at this great sight, and see why the bush is not burned up."⁴When the Lord saw that he had turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." Exodus 3:2-4

I read the story of Moses encountering God in the burning bush many times before I realized that God doesn't just begin speaking to Moses to get his attention. Instead, it is only after Moses says, "I need to take a closer look at what is happening" that he finds himself face to face with God. Curiosity is one of the great gifts of faith. Curiosity is what led me to becoming a pastor. I wanted to know more about God, more about angels, more about the spiritual world and I went looking for answers. Fortunately, I didn't find the answer, instead I encountered God in the mystery. I think Moses would probably say the same thing. When he approached the burning bush seeking to understand how this bush wasn't being consumed, he discovered that in his experience with God he had many, many more questions, and yet the questions led him into a radical transformation.



Over this past year, we have been working on not only identifying our values at Grace Lutheran, but also on our mission and vision for the future. The Vision Board spent time praying, and listening to one another, reading scripture, and together we came up with the vision of being Grace, a community of faith united by God's love to listen, to grow, and to serve in Jesus' name, so that all might experience grace. How do we do this? One of the first ways we live out this mission is in being curious. Curious about what God's word is saying to us. Curious about new people. Curious about how people are, that we have not seen in a while. Curious about ways that we can expand and grow our ability to help our neighbor. Curiosity will lead us to stop for a moment and not just assume that we already know the answer, but take time to see something from a different perspective.

We share the women's bathroom with the toddlers during the week. More often then not, diapers are being changed and potty training is happening when I go into the bathroom. Conversation is real when you are in the bathroom with children, and boy are they curious. The toddlers consistently ask- what's that? Or why? Leah, one of the teachers in the toddler room, will respond by saying, "Yep, we are in the why phase right now" while smiling as I attempt to answer the toddlers' questions. I love the why stage! The toddlers are not only concerned about why something is this way for them, but for others too. "Why do you do that?" "Why do you like that?" Why? Why?

There are big things happening at Grace. We sold our land on Nightingale for just over \$975,000 and we have presented three different architecture plans for our future. Some of you are asking why? Why do we need to expand our building right now? Why do we need to change the configuration of the daycare or class-rooms? Why do we need a new entrance? These are great questions! I hope that you will take the time to ask these questions. I hope that you will meet Sandy Schmoll our Daycare Director and find out about this important ministry happening in our walls. I hope that you will talk to visitors and ask them about how they found their way around the building when they first came. I hope that you will stop by on a Wednesday night and see our classrooms filled with children and youth. I hope that you will ask community members how they see Grace Lutheran Church, and how we might serve them.

In asking these questions, you might just discover that God is busy at work right beside you and you hadn't really noticed. In taking a closer look, you might realize that God's got an important mission in store for us and that just as Moses was sent to free the Israelites, God is sending us with a message to share with the world, that God's love, God's freedom, and God's forgiveness is for everyone so that they might experience grace. We need a reboot. In computing terms, rebooting is:

"The process by which a running computer system is restarted, either intentionally or unintentionally. Reboots can be either cold (alternatively known as hard), in which the power to the system is physically turned off and back on again causing an initial boot of the machine, or warm (or soft) in which the system restarts without the need to interrupt the power. The term restart is used to refer to a reboot when the operating system closes all programs and finalizes all pending input and output operating before initiating a soft reboot." Or think of it this way: A hard reboot "means that the system is not shut down in an orderly manner, skipping file system synchronization and other activities that would occur on an orderly shutdown." A soft reboot, or restart, is when "the operating system ensures that all pending I/O operations are gracefully ended before commencing a reboot."

There was nothing graceful about the onset of COVID-19, just as there is nothing as simple or easy as a soft restart at its end. It was a hard, cold shutdown, and we now face a hard, cold reboot.

On Rally Sunday, as great and as fun as the day was, only a few people helped to set up and take down. I have to confess and apologize that I lost my cool that day, I'm sorry to the people who witnessed that. Recently I have had to make the pain staking, heart breaking decision to cancel our Love of Grace Bazaar due to multiple reasons, but one was the lack of volunteers to be on our team and we were afraid we would not get the large amount of volunteers needed to make the event successful, like we have had for many years in the past.

We are blessed to have many opportunities at Grace to have fun, to learn, to sing, to serve, to teach, to show love, to give care, to feed the hungry, to supply needs to the children, to quilt, to knit, to mow, to garden, to cook, to lead projects, on and on. Please oh please don't let any of this stop! We need you to keep things going and we are here to help you discern what your niche might be, and walk along side of you to get you going. Many hands make little work. Reach out to me or any of the staff or other leaders for guidance.

Grace4Rakai

Update

Many of you have been asking how the community over in Rakai, Uganda have been doing since the Delta variant of the COVID-19 virus began circling



the globe over the past several months. The Ugandan government did call for another lockdown back in June, as there were no vaccines available in the country.

Good News! Although there was a surge of cases in the cities, Rakai, which is largely rural saw very few cases and the situation has stabilized. Markets are beginning to re-open and schools are hoping to follow in October. During this entire pandemic, African Children Today (ACT), has continued to pay their teachers, who have tutored all of the Grace sponsored children (and many others) remotely. It's been an incredible amount of extra work, but it has worked in Rakai, and permitted our Grace sponsored students to continue learning throughout this pandemic! Grace sponsored students in 7th and 11th grade sat for national exams this past April, right before the recent lockdown. ALL of them PASSED their exams with the equivalent of an A or B. It is amazing how God has Blessed them!

Mark your calendars! The weekend of November 13-14th, we will be celebrating the ACT ministries that Grace supports over in Rakai, Uganda! Ann Hill and Richard Johnson from ACT will be delivering an uplifting message during worship, which will be taped and "live" on Sunday morning. Between services on Sunday morning the 14th, we will also host another "Live from Rakai" event from the Grace Worship Center, where Ann and Richard will bring us up to date with the various ministries over in Rakai, and take your questions! There will also be an opportunity to sponsor children, purchase products made by the Hope Again Women, and support the new ACT High School which hopes to open in February 2022! It will be an exciting weekend in November – please plan to be a part of it!

Meets every other Tuesday at 1:30pm, for up to 90 minutes in Grace Classrooms 105/107




Ruth Circle


What is God like?

One of the sites involves some standing so you are welcome to bring a lawn chair.

We (at Grace) are asking for \$25 per person which we will collect as everyone arrives; the remainder will be covered by other funds.
