Dear Grace Friends,

Over the past few years, I have really come to love the Easter Season. Now, don't get me wrong, I have always loved the Easter Story, it is after all the pivotal story of our faith, but the Easter Season has become a time of great reflection and spiritual renewal for me. There is something about living in the midst of death and resurrection that helps you look at things differently. While, this has always been a part of my ministry, I feel like the pandemic, and the various changes over the past few years have made it even more apparent.

Currently, I am on retreat with Pastor Maria. We are spending time praying, reflecting, visioning and planning. Part of our time is spent looking backward and part of our time is looking ahead. For the last two years, we have gone on retreat together and we use the Easter Narrative as our centering scripture for our time together. This year, we have been reading through John's Gospel, just like we do in church together. Yesterday, most of our time was spent celebrating the success of last year, as well as considering what we need to do differently and how we might move ahead. The Easter narrative has provided a helpful framework. We spent time contemplating Jesus' words to Mary: Do not hold onto me and wondered what things we might be holding onto that we might need to release in order to follow Jesus into this next stage of ministry. We wondered about Jesus' proclamation that he has not yet ascended and considered what "we have not yet done."

I hope you will join Pastor Maria and me in reflecting on these questions of what are you holding on to and what have we not yet done? Could you reflect on these questions as an individual, family, and then what this means for us as a church community?

What is evident in the Easter Gospel is that although Jesus has died and been raised, the truth is Mary, and the other disciples just want to go back to the way it was before. I feel this! Don't you? Wouldn't it be great if we could just return to what felt safe, comfortable, and dependable? It was working, wasn't it? Maybe, maybe not. It brought people to faith, for sure and it also got Jesus killed so.... Maybe some change was needed. The ministry was also completely dependent on Jesus to guide them every step of the way. And one of the things that happens on the other side of the resurrection is Jesus helps the disciples see that God is within them and guiding them forward. That they don't need Jesus or the past to dictate each step, but together they will move forward in a new and different way. There will be an expansion of ministry because of the other voices and people who are brought to the table.

We have a big change on the horizon at Grace. The Vision Board has decided to eliminate our Saturday night worship and concentrate our efforts on Wednesday evening instead.* I am thankful for the faith filled contemplation of the Vision Board as they have prayed about our worship schedule and what is best for the future of Grace. I know that there is loss in the discontinuation of something that was loved and appreciated. I pray that we might consider what's next and how God is leading us forward.

Wednesday evening worship will begin on June 1st at 7pm. We will also be inviting everyone to a bible study at 6pm. I hope you will come. We will be studying the lesson that will be preached on that evening and have time for conversation and prayer. You do not need to prepare to come to the bible study, or even have a bible, just bring yourself and a willingness to listen and learn. We will also be offering a kids' time on Weds. night during the sermon, where kids will be excused for 10-15 minutes to play and learn with each other and an adult leader. We hope this will allow more families to join us during the summer months.

Being people of faith together is complicated. One of the things I appreciate about the Easter Gospel is that the various characters need different things. Mary needs to find Jesus in the garden, Thomas needs to put his hands in Jesus' wounds, Peter needs forgiveness. Jesus is able to recognize the needs of his beloved people and also help them move ahead. None of them are allowed to hold onto the way it was before, but they all have to live on the other side of the resurrection. This is where we live too, on the other side of the resurrection where Jesus greets us in love, reminds us we are beloved, comes to us in our doubt, forgives us our sins, and sends us forward in faith. I give thanks to God for this gift and for all of you!


New Building Plans

- Expanded Kitchen, Food Shelf and Narthex



Transforming Inside & Out



God has been doing amazing transforming in the life and ministry of Grace Lutheran. I am so thankful!

During the final weeks of March, we invited you to bring your first fruit offerings to Grace for our Generosity Appeal. As of April 20th, 2022, 138 families have made commitments of \$1,560,533 and \$174,986 has already been received. More than 10% of our pledged amount has been given and we exceeded our campaign goal by \$360,000! The generosity of all of you is apparent and abundant. Thanks be to God! Please know it is not too late to be a part of this campaign.

Because of this, we have gone back to our architect and asked for an additional plans (see page 4) that takes into consideration some of the concerns we heard from all of you about a need for more storage and for better kitchen facilities. Do not miss our congregational meeting on May 22nd at 10am where we will be voting on the next step in our building project, presenting some timelines, as well as voting on new Vision Board members. Time to Take the Leap?

I decided to give more of my time, both inside and outside of church, leaving less time for me and my family. I prayed during the capital campaign, and I felt compelled to give more of my financial resources. I took a step forward in my personal goal of tithing, leaving less money in my checking account. And guess what? I still have everything I need and then some.

No one is suffering because of these choices I have made. In fact, it is the exact opposite. I've gained new friendships with people I otherwise might not have crossed paths with. I have experienced the ability to let go a little and trust that I have enough. I am setting an example for my children, and conversations have opened up between us because of these changes. I feel the abundance of God and am thankful I've taken these leaps of faith.

Grace's Green Kitchen

A reflection on Creation Care

Growing up, every year on or around Earth Day, my dad and I would take spring's first bike ride! In theory, it was a bike ride. In actuality, it was a "bike walk and pick up trash in the alley behind our house and in neighborhood parks" all day event! What a trick my dad played! We still need to clarify with my dad when we go on walks, "Dad, is this a trash pick up walk or a walk, walk?" He has instilled in me a care for God's creation that

I am still thankful for to this day! As I reflect on this practice from my youth, I think about the other adjustments I have made in my life and that we have made as a church to continue to care for God's creation. You might wonder why care for the environment is even pertinent for people of faith. Shouldn't we be learning about forgiveness? Scripture? Prayer? The truth of the matter comes from humankind's very first God given job!

In the beginning, when God created the heaven and the earth and made all living things including humans, God said, "Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth" (Genesis 1:26).

Dominion in this instance doesn't mean control or rule, but rather dominion is our opportunity for care for the earth and everything in, on, and around it in the way that God provides, nurtures, and cares for us! What a holy call that God has given to each of us!

Last August, we moved to having a green kitchen at Grace and Seeds of Grace Preschool and Daycare Center. This means we are no longer using paper or plastic throw away products in our kitchen. We cannot accept any donations of these products either. We share an energy efficient combination dishwasher sanitizer with Seeds of Grace. The dishwasher allows us to wash and sanitize any dishes (including communion cups) efficiently and quickly. Whenever an outreach or program team uses the kitchen at Grace these are our new guidelines. Please note our dishwasher does require a brief 5 minute tutorial but is so simple to use. We also have whole new sets of dishes, cups, bowls, and silverware for all our events and programming! Thank you for helping us keep our kitchen green and live into our call to care for God's creation!



Vision Board



Dear Grace Lutheran Church,
Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed!

As we reflect on this past Easter season, we recognize that after death there is new life. We see it all around us in the spring season. Seeds are sprouting, the birds are singing and soon the flowers will be blooming. God's promise is everywhere! Isaiah 43:18-19 says, *Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it. I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.*

The Vision Board has come to the decision to discontinue Saturday evening service. We know this is difficult to hear. We value all our members and the unique ways in which they connect at Grace. We have been weighing this decision for more than a year and have invited those involved in Saturday night worship to listening sessions. Because of the feedback received, we spent this whole academic year experimenting and assessing what is best for the future of Grace. There are several reasons why we feel this change is necessary.

While the staff have flexibility in their work agreement, the pastoral and music staff have been working too many hours. They do not routinely get two consecutive days off; they are missing out on family events and personal time. We must be mindful of protecting our staff from burnout. Having a meaningful and consistent Sabbath is commanded by God and essential to the health and well-being of their ministry.

Depth of our preaching staff has decreased with the departure of Debbie Jorgens and Pastor Hahn's passing.

We have been unable to hire musicians for Saturday evening service. Saturday is a key time for musicians to be hired for more profitable wages.

We have heard a desire to have a Wednesday evening worship during the summer. This might lead to further community outreach as we provide a non-weekend option.

Saturday service consistently has 19 -39 people in attendance and seems to be holding steady here.

There are faithful and connected people at the Saturday evening service. We are so thankful for the leadership and commitment of this group. The Vision Board and staff at Grace support all lay lead ministries and believe this is the time, that Saturday worshippers might explore different lay-lead options for Saturday evening. We are excited to see what new offerings might be birthed with the discontinuation of Saturday service (examples: leading small groups at Grace, dinner church, or an innovative gathering at an outside venue to increase our community footprint).

The last Saturday worship will be held May 21st. We will be having a potluck, and fellowship time in thanksgiving for the wonderful community on Saturday night.

This year, we added a Wednesday evening worship as part of our catechism curriculum and is something we would like to continue as we go into the future. It is our plan to move to a Wednesday evening worship this summer. Wednesday worship will begin on June 1st at 7pm. This worship will be adapted from what we have been doing during the year to be a more comprehensive worship: celebrating Holy Communion regularly (at least 2x a month), contemporary music, with a kids' message and kids' time. The preaching staff will be using the sermon from the prior Sunday. We believe Wednesday nights will give us the opportunity to reach those who have busy weekends or are away at cabins. We also have already found Wednesday worship to be successful, and we would like to continue to adapt and grow it to be consistent throughout the year.

The Vision Board as always is available for questions and discussion.
