

A Year of Change

2022 has been a year of change. So many changes have happened within my own life, and within the church. At the end of August, I will move my oldest daughter to college at the University of Wisconsin- Madison (Go Badgers!) and my youngest daughter will start high school. My dad just recently put a down-payment on an apartment under construction in Minnetonka and plans to list his house in Plymouth this fall. This is the house I grew up in and my parents built when I was 3 years old. These changes bring about many emotions. As I drove out of my parents' driveway today, I teared up thinking about leaving behind this home that had so wonderfully housed our family and contains so many memories. What will it feel like to no longer belong there? I can only imagine now, but soon enough I will be living this reality.

Loss and goodbyes have been a part of this year for me, but it doesn't make it easier. As much as I know the right thing for my dad is to live somewhere else, this change is still hard. I want the best for him.

I have similar thoughts about Grace. We have undergone a lot of change and a lot of loss as well. And even more change is on the horizon. On July 19th we sent out this notice in Grace at a Glance.



After much prayer, contemplation, and with the guidance of consultants, the Vision Board at Grace, along with Pastor Joanna Mitchell and the personnel team, have decided to change our staffing model. Churches across the nation are changing in response to the effects of the pandemic, which includes declined attendance and more people either worshipping online or not at all. Here at Grace, we have experienced these same changes. We have also noticed a disconnection from some of our children, youth, and their families and at the same time, having new families come to Grace and get involved in our programming.

To implement a new vision of ministry for children, youth, and family at Grace, we will be eliminating the position of Youth Director starting in August and will be hiring a Director of Children, Youth and Family (CYF) Ministry. This new position will create an opportunity to make connections and build relationships with families across all ages from three years old through high school. Our hope is to rebuild our CYF program by finding ways to integrate our families, encourage faith development, and spend time listening to the wants and needs of our young people. We recognize this change is hard, and along with the new vision, there is a loss of what was.

As a result of this change in our staffing and ministry approach, we will be saying goodbye to Kristi Larson on August 14th at our Sunday worship services. Kristi has faithfully served at Grace Lutheran for 7 years and has shaped and molded the faith of our young people in meaningful ways. She has led many mission trips, developed leaders and life-long servants through Summer Stretch, cared for our families through Green Ribbon, and made a mark on so many of us with her humor and faithfulness. I hope you will join me in celebrating Kristi's ministry, giving thanks for all that she has shared, and wishing her well as she moves into the next chapter in her career.

This change is a big one for us at Grace and I know that some of you might wonder about the timing. After COVID and with all the changes hitting us, we feel strongly that we need to take another look at our programming for our Children, Youth, and Family with fresh eyes and try something different. Our programming has been so meaningful to many families, and we are so grateful for the faithful leadership of Kristi and others throughout the years.

You might be wondering what will happen in between. We have already been in contact with an interim youth ministry company, who has presented to Vision Board. We will interview a candidate that they have recommended to lead our Children, Youth and Family this fall, while we also post the position and get ourselves ready to interview and find the right candidate. We have spent a lot of time planning for our children and youth this fall and will notice a change to some of our programming.

I am even more excited to see in what new ways God will be able to mold and shape me as one of His precious children. Summer does not equal lazy days though we try our best to find them amongst the busy days of our lives. Just like gardens and baseball seasons, many things just don't rest. The Building Task Force has been one of those organizations that hasn't rested.

In terms of importance per congregational surveys, the sanctuary has been noted as the number one concern for our transformational project. The ability to hear the spoken word and the full spectrum of music within the service, along with lighting and

video to support the message, is the first call of the Task Force. To that, we have fully jumped in to the challenge.

To accomplish the expectations we need to address the audio equipment. Microphones and their optimal placements, speakers sized and spaced within the space and amplification to bring the sound forward. We have contacted experts in sound engineering to carry this load. The other aspect of improving the sound are the walls within the sanctuary "box". This box has been a real challenge to the Task Force. The architects have worked with sound engineers and have an initial series of renderings that will enhance the sound qualities, but choices have to be made to provide the most cost effective design that also provides that elusive sweet spot for sound. We are also working toward mitigating the sounds from Bunker Lake Boulevard traffic.

Another element mentioned earlier is the visual component of the worship experience. This too is supported by outside experts in cameras and screens and their recommendations will be incorporated into the final design.

Lighting is important in our quest for a welcoming space. Does that mean more windows on the north side of the facility or more and better lighting or some combination of all? Windows are also more 'transparent' to sound so additional windows may mean Bunker Lake mitigation has a bit more challenge to it. We are looking at all options from replacing fixtures on the ceiling to windows to light panels to wall sconce lighting.

Additionally, we are looking at the overall inviting qualities of the sanctuary. This includes the color palette, banner utilization, wall coverings and furnishings.

This all is to be completed within the budget we have set forth. We also believe this sanctuary work could be the first area of change in the overall project. The Building Task Force is excited to see this through and we truly believe that you, the congregation, will agree the effort was successful.

Additional forward progress has been made with the completed survey of the property, which will anchor the continuing design efforts.

Grounds Ministry

Responsibilities

The grounds ministry team engages in small landscaping projects, rock bed maintenance, tree and stump removal, tree maintenance, grape vine maintenance and planting small patches of grass.

Schedule

The work sessions are scheduled as needed. Since there are no weekly scheduled work sessions, the work is often done in concert with the Garden Ministry team. A pruning work session is usually scheduled in late February or early March. A rock bed clean-up and preening work session is usually scheduled in early April, after the snow is gone.

Tasks

The tasks undertaken are pruning (think chainsaw, tree saw, or large nippers), blight marking and monitoring, feeding (think tree spikes), watering (especially river birch during droughts), pest monitoring and removal (think tent caterpillars), edging maintenance (rock beds), smaller stump removal, and mulching.

2022/2023 Challenges

Starting this year and continuing for the next couple years, our church's building plans will result in the displacement of most of our rock beds and some of our trees.

Responsibilities

The garden ministry team engages in urn planting and maintenance, flower bed planting and maintenance, shrub maintenance, and ornamental tree maintenance.

Schedule

Weekly work sessions on Wednesdays run from May through September and depending on the temperature will be either at 6:30 PM or 6:30 AM, yes AM! A pruning work session is usually scheduled in late February or early March and a preening work session is usually scheduled in early April, after the snow is gone.

Tasks

The tasks undertaken are planting, deadheading, weeding, applying preen, spraying weeds, dividing plants, pruning, mulching, edging maintenance, trapping, and watering (including sprinkler head adjustments and replacements).

Challenges

Starting this year and continuing for the next couple years, our church's building plans will result in the displacement of most of our current flower beds and many of our shrubs. The perennial flowers and some smaller shrubs will need to be transplanted away from our church and then transplanted back by our church after construction is completed.

Needs

Larger pots for transplanting.

Long Range Goal


To have different ensemble members provide instrumental music at worship at least once a month.

- Sand Creek Monthly Meetings and Sharing Grace Food Bags-We meet the first Thursday at 3:45pm for our meeting and then packing our monthly Sharing Grace Food Bags during the school year.
- School Supplies will be collected and delivered to Sand Creek the first week of school, Sept. 6th-9th. Posting of the school needs and collecting the school supply donations will be the weekends of August 21st, August 28th, and Sept 4th. Donations should be brought to the narthex and then the team will deliver them to Sand Creek.
- Warm mittens/gloves and hats donations will be held during the months of October/November and delivered to Sand Creek as we accumulate enough for delivery and their needs.
- Christmas Adopt-A-Family-This event begins mid-November, prior to Black Friday shopping on Nov 25th, for the Grace "Adopters" to signup for the families. The collection of gifts and/or gift cards will be Dec 11th/18th for delivery to SC on Dec 22nd.

Holiday Food Boxes Packing—These are approximate packing dates according to the holiday dates. We usually pack from 8-9:00 a.m.

- Thanksgiving Nov 24th, 2022-Packing and delivery on Nov 22nd in the morning to SC. We will be asking for 10-14lb. frozen turkey donations during the two weeks prior Nov. 6th and 13th.
- Christmas Dec 24-25, 2022-Packing and delivery on Dec 22nd in the morning to SC. We may be asking for Simek's frozen lasagna donations during the two weeks prior Dec 11th and 18th.
- Spring Break/No school-March 10th-20th, 2023 - Packing and delivery on March 9th in the morning to SC. We usually get Thrivent Action Dollars to pay for this event.

Grace 2 Haiti Update and Upcoming Mission Trip

As most of us know, in July of 2021, Haiti's President was assassinated in his home. Since that time Haiti has been plagued by unrest and violence. The country is largely run by gangs at this time. Kidnappings and ransom demands are commonplace. Many Haitians


are leaving Port Au Prince, where the conditions are the worst, and fleeing to the countryside. The villages where Grace 2 Haiti have been active, Luly and Williamson, are swelling with people coming in from Port Au Prince. Many of the Haitian staff and community members that we have gotten to know over the years are now hosting additional family members in their meager homes.

Because of the unsafe conditions, we must delay any trips to Haiti until the conditions on the ground become safe. We still have a love for Haiti and for the Haitian people, along with a desire to serve them. It is important to note that the programs on the ground that we are supporting are still active. World Wide Village is supporting and operating schools. The Healthy Mothers/Healthy Babies program is thriving. The wells that we helped dig are providing 56,000 gallons of clean, safe drinking water every month. There are also 25 students sponsored in the sewing program by the Robin's Nest Foundation that was set up by the Zupon's and other members of Grace. The programs that we support are not just continuing, but even growing and serving more Haitians. Even though we are unable to go to Haiti, we still feel it is important to provide in-person outreach on an international level through our church. We have identified another organization, Bold Hope, which we will be partnering with for our 2023 mission trip. Haiti also holds a special place in the hearts of members of the Bold Hope organization. Bold Hope started their mission work in Haiti in 2010 and expanded into other countries starting in 2019. This is one of the reasons why we feel Bold Hope is a good fit for us to continue our mission work.

We will be traveling to Belize with Bold Hope from March 11th to the 17th. We will be working and staying in an ocean side village and assisting with the construction of a community center and spending time with the children in school. The specific details of our activities will be finalized as we work together to prepare for the trip. This mission trip is multi-generational, and we would love to have you join us on this new endeavor. We will be having an informational meeting about this trip at 6:00PM on Wed., August 10th. Grace's Partnership With HOPE 4 Youth

For over nine years Grace has been in partnership with HOPE 4 Youth, one of the few organizations in the North Metro Area dedicated to helping young people, especially ages 16-24, find pathways out of homelessness. No matter the reasons for their situations,

HOPE 4 Youth provides free meals, a place to shower and wash clothes, computer access for studying or looking for job applications, but most of all, it provides mentors to listen to the youths' needs and steer them on the right track. And the need keeps increasing. This year has seen a 52% increase in youth attendance, with 50 new youth this last month alone.

Besides the Center, HOPE also operates a 12 apartment housing facility called HOPE Place in Coon Rapids, which is not only full, but has a waiting list.

Sometimes, it's simply listening to what a young person needs and providing information regarding resources, such as one young man who was struggling with chemical dependency, who not only met his goals of sobriety, but managed to secure stable housing and employment. He later called his case manager to thank her for believing in him.

Recently, the Center expanded its kitchen facilities to allow for some food preparation on site. Consequently, the Grace H4Y Committee decided to expand its commitment to the Center and bring in a meal at least once a month. It would only require about 4 volunteers at a time. Possibilities also involve supplying some nonperishable food items as well as clothing. See the HOPE 4 Youth website for a more detailed list.

Family Promise

FamilyPromise in Anoka County Family Promise appreciates your continued commitment to work with us throughout all the challenges and changes due to the pandemic. When the pandemic began, it was a fearful time and we all faced difficulties. We were all told to stay home to stay safe. Many workplaces transitioned to workfrom-home. School took place virtually from home as well. But imagine being told to stay home and stay safe when you don't have a home. That was the reality for many families throughout our community.

In March of 2020, due to Covid 19, Family Promise had to end the rotational shelter program that had served so well for nearly 10 years. But the problem of homelessness hadn't gone away. We had to find creative, new ways to serve families with no safe place to go. For the past two years, we have been housing families in extended stay hotels, thanks to assistance from the county and the state, while congregations like ours have continued to provide hospitality and support to the families.

Throughout the last two years, Family Promise has also added new programming to serve more families, helping them avoid the trauma of homelessness. Our new Prevention programming helps people before they lose their housing find a way to keep it or move to a new, sustainable home. Stabilization programming helps ensure families who have moved out of shelter and into housing are able to keep it sustainably. These programs mean that Family Promise is now serving twice as many families as it did before. We've learned a lot in the past two years and despite the chaos of the pandemic we were provided the opportunity to reimagine how we can best serve families in our community. As we look toward the future, we have big plans to create a more sustainable, trauma-informed shelter program.

Our vision is to create a guest house, where our families could have the security and consistency of being able to stay in one place instead of rotating from place to place, giving more opportunities for parents to work and a more "normal" feeling experience for children.

I close with a passage from 1 John, Chapter 3. "17 If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on them, how can the love of God be in that person? 18 Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth."

Grace Lutheran has seen the need and lives out this calling through the work you do in the community. Thank you for partnering with Family Promise to put God's love into action as we work together to help families experiencing housing insecurity build a foundation of lasting independence. Tom Miller has recently assumed the role of Family Promise Coordinator at Grace. Please extend the same support, cooperation and patience you have given me over the years. 


