Today (November 27th) kicked off the Season of Advent. It also is the anniversary of my Ordination. I have been in ministry 18 years, which is amazing and also hard to believe. The weather has also been in the mid-40s or 50s all weekend. It just doesn't seem like the Holiday season is really upon us. I confess when we lit the Advent Wreath this morning, and we sang Advent and Christmas Songs, it all took me by surprise. "Already? It's too warm! How can it be Advent?" And yet, here we are.

Often, we skip immediately to the Christmas story in Luke when we think of Advent. We remember how the angel came to Mary and promised her the Holy Spirit and shook Joseph's world. But Advent texts don't get to Jesus that quickly. They usually linger in anticipation, reminding us of the signs and seasons of our world, inviting us to contemplation and preparation. Pastor Maria preached this first Sunday in Advent on Habakkuk (one of the lesser-known prophets) about sign-posts and hopefulness. Next week, we will hear from the book of Esther about how we have been called to speak into moments of trial for the most vulnerable, and eventually we will get to the Christmas story, where we will be reminded of the chaos of how it all started. How Mary and Joseph's relationship was in question, how God comes in dreams and amid all the mess, God continues to proclaim the promise over and over again. I am with you!



As we conclude 2022, I relate to this Season of Advent. This past year has been one of waiting, anticipation, and preparation. Some of the waiting has been so hard, like waiting for Pastor Maria to return to work after her stroke. "How long, O Lord! Indeed!" Or waiting at the airport as I traveled to see my mom in her sickness. Or on a more hopeful note, waiting for our building project to get started, especially since some of the bills are already coming in. "How long till the sound is fixed?" "How long until our bathrooms are accessible?" "How long, O Lord! Indeed!" I have discovered that as much as waiting can be hard, it is made a lot easier when I don't come in with all sorts of preconceived notions about how it should

go. If I prepare myself to wait, then I can just go with the flow (as a planner this is easier said than done.).

We have recently hired Donlar Construction to be our Construction Manager at Risk. I am excited about this partnership. They are going to help us manage and stay within our budget and be helping us as we move along and eventually break ground. According to all the timelines I have seen, we should be concluding our project by December 2023, just one year from now. It doesn't seem possible. How can all of this happen when nothing has yet started?

But it is time. Time to start. Time to move forward. Time to break ground. Time to enter the chaos. This will probably actually start to happen in the spring, but I can feel it ramping up. I know that nothing can really prepare me for what's ahead, but that I need to follow the example of Habakkuk, Esther, Mary and Joseph and trust God. Trust that God will be with us in the chaos. Trust in the vision that God has given us to break down barriers and open up our building and allow grace to flow beyond these walls and to those who have not yet heard the good news of God's love, acceptance and forgiveness. As we are reminded in this Season of Anticipation, God is indeed with us in it all (please remind me about this in June, when I don't have an office) guiding and leading the way forward in faith and hope. So come, let us live in hope and trust together.

Reconnecting





For the past four years, Family Promise in Anoka County has been working toward creating a permanent site for our organization, staff, and families to create a more stable environment for the children in our shelter program, and improve the guest experience and outcomes for all our programs. While we have had some possibilities along the way, for various reasons none have worked out. Now, however, there are two incentives for believing change will be coming very soon!

First, due to a pending property sale at Lord of Life Church we know we will someday, in the near future, need to leave the space we have been renting for nearly 10 years. Lord of Life has been a fantastic partner for us and continues to advocate for us, but they have been offered a great opportunity for their own sustainability, which means at some point soon the property where the Day Center sits will be redeveloped. While we can stay until that time comes, it makes the most sense for us to create a plan to move soon so we don't cause problems for our program, or Lord of Life with a hurried transition.

Secondly, we have an accepted offer to purchase two properties which would allow us to move our offices and day center to one property and ultimately build shelter and housing on the other neighboring property. We are now waiting for a funding decision on grant money to help us purchase the properties; thoughts, prayers, and good vibes that everything is approved would be greatly appreciated!

We hope to be able to share additional details about this exciting opportunity very soon!





We will travel by van from Andover to an assigned region (we find out in March where we are going) where we will spend a week working on homes and connecting with families who are in need of home maintenance and repair.

When I was a youth, I participated in this project for all three years of my high school career. The families I met and the work we did impacted me profoundly and gave me a great appreciation for all that I have, and a desire to give back. I remember being quite nervous about participating in this project. I didn't know much about construction and was unsteady with a hammer and a nail. And yet, each year I came home having done something I never thought I could do, for example reroofing a house, restoring a floor, building a deck and more. I know that others in our group felt the same way. Today, I am a proud member of the Women's Build with Habitat for Humanity because I enjoy being able to work with my hands and use some power tools.

We have 15 spots reserved for youth and need 6 adults as volunteers. ASP serves West Virginia, Virginia, Kentucky and Tennessee. We will be staying at a school or community center. Fundraising and scholarships are available. Cost of the trip is \$650 which includes travel expenses. As of November 27th there are only 4 spots remaining.
