



It was just a year ago that I took my first frantic trip to Arizona to see my mom. My dad had texted on January 6th, Epiphany, with the fear that my mom might be nearing the end. In truth, she had a bad 24 hours, but the reality was, even though it wasn't days away, it wasn't much longer that we had with her. In January, I left events at Grace two times and flew to Arizona in a panic to see my mom. Worried about her, worried about my dad, and already grieving the loss that was to come, while also being unable to predict when, where or how it would be. There were so many unanswered questions and a lot of

living in the disorder. All I could do was show up to the best of my ability and allow that to be enough. And it was. It was enough. I spent quality time with my mom, dad, and sister. I got to be there at the end. Now as I turn the page on the calendar, I feel echoes of my journey from last year in my body. The grief is resurfacing in a new and different way. There are big dates in my future: my dad's birthday, my birthday and the one-year anniversary of my mom's death. Days that I hadn't recognized until I changed the calendar. I always knew the first year, this year of firsts is a hard one. But I have been surprised at what has been easy and what has been harder. Christmas went better than I anticipated, but a renewed sorrow has crept in on my drives to and from work. I have noticed my kids have started to talk a little more about their own loss.

I have been meeting with my therapist for 6 months now. Somehow wading through this year in all of the transitions in both my family and the church. He has been helpful in allowing me to have perspective, to process various dynamics, and in naming the truth that it has been, and it is a lot.

During the last few months at Grace, many of you have experienced the loss of a loved one. Our list of those who are grieving is long. As I have received word of each loss, I feel a sorrow deep in my gut. It's a little more visceral than it was before, because my body has now experienced this type of pain and I know it is more than just in mind and spirit that one experiences grief. It is a whole-body thing. I want you to know that I am praying for you. We as a staff pray every week for the needs of our church. Our first half hour of staff meeting is spent in devotion and prayer. If you have special prayer requests, please reach out to any one of us on staff and we will be sure to bring your concern to our prayer time.

I also want you to know that Grace is a part of the North Metro Grief Coalition. They offer grief support twice a year, 6 weeks prior to Christmas and 7 weeks prior to Easter (they avoid Holy Week). It takes place on Thursday at local churches and includes a speaker as well as a small group time.

While, I am happy about the ability to point toward these resources, I also recognize that they are limited. Our Circle of Grace group is considering starting a grief group and I am thankful for the leadership of our team in examining this. If you are interested in being a part of the grief group or would like more support in your grief, please reach out. Both Pastor Maria and I are available to listen. We would also like to get you in touch with some of our leaders who are working on grief ministry.

On February 22nd, we will join together for Ash Wednesday at Grace. We welcome you to come either at 1pm or at 7pm. This worship service kicks off the beginning of Lent, a time or reflection and a time of deepening our faith. On Ash Wednesday we confess our own mortality, and we are invited to remember that we are dust and to dust we shall return. It is a confession I have remembered a lot in this past year. Our world tries to avoid death. We use other phrases like passed away, or have changed our wedding vows to as long as we both shall live, instead of death do us part. The truth is, while we might want to believe that death is not real, it very much is. And in fact, our faith invites us to remember. To remember that we are born finite. To remember that God is present with us in our life and yes, also in our death. That death is not something we need to fear because it has been overcome by the cross and the grave.

As we enter New Year and look forward to new possibilities at Grace and in our own lives, we also are invited to examine the losses and all of the ways God has been faithful throughout it all.

Godspell | The Musical

A couple of months ago, a friend reached out with an opportunity. She shared with me that a theater in Woodbury was holding auditions for the musical Godspell. She wondered if I wanted to audition. I thought about it and days turned to weeks and all of a sudden it was audition week and I had a decision to make. Many of you may know, theater has always been a part of my life. I grew up performing in my grandparent's base-

ment, productions written and directed and performed by me (and my cousins, I guess). Then I auditioned for community theater and theater in school. All leading to a three and a half year hiatus from school between high school and college when I traveled the world singing and dancing and teaching kids with a group called the Young Americans. I even continued to perform in college and throughout seminary. But starting my "big girl" job and COVID, I hadn't found the time or the right opportunity to continue this passion. I thought this is my shot!

This year at Grace we will be steeped in the Gospel According to St. Matthew. Perfect! I thought. Stephen Schwartz (Wicked, Pippin, Children of Eden) the writer of Godspell the musical used the Gospel of St. Matthew in his writing of this musical! The content of the show would help deepen my study of this Gospel for preaching and teaching here at Grace! The timing was right too. We would be set to perform the last two weekends of February, before the chaos of Lenten programming really gets started. And speaking of Lent, what better way to get in the mood than to perform Jesus' life and ministry and crucifixion as one of his disciples? I also wanted to know if I still could do it? After a few years off the stage and surviving a stroke, who knows if I would even make it. So, I had made up my mind. I would audition. And I did. And I made it. The correlations didn't stop there. Once rehearsals began. I learned more about Open Door Community Theater in Woodbury. Every show they produce, a percentage of the proceeds go toward an area charity. They give back! For Godspell, the charity they are supporting is called Angels of Hope, a group that is supporting women and families who have lost a child, a cause that is very near to my heart. My mom had a still born baby when I was 5 years old, my brother Joseph.

This is my invitation to all of you! To come and see: Godspell! The show is structured as a series of parables primarily based on the Gospel of Matthew, emphasizing Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Chapter 5). The cast evolves from individual voices to one voice; operating and moving as one unit, a community! Jesus acts as the conduit to bring them together. Together we build a "beautiful city" by celebrating our community and connecting as individuals. Godspell is the perfect show to fully embrace and actively live out our Open Door mission of giving back, fostering inclusiveness, and supporting community. Performances will be February 17, 18, 19 and February 24, 25, and 26th at King of Kings Lutheran Church in Woodbury. Fridays and Saturdays are at 7 pm and Sunday matinees are at 3 pm. Lastly, thank you! This show is an ensemble show which means there are very few moments when we are not all on stage together. Rehearsals require all of us to be there. Throughout some of January and all of February, I will be at rehearsals and unavailable for week day evening meetings and programming. I really do hope that you can make it to one of the performances, and believe this show will be a great prequel to our Lenten journeys as we journey with Jesus to the cross.

Time Of Waiting



Building Updates

Building Task Force Update



The Building Task Force has met throughout the year with their efforts trained on providing the best finished product within the budget, as established by the sale of the Nightingale property and the fundraising of Transforming Inside and Out. It must also be mentioned that the current economic conditions have added, or more so, subtracted from our project. Higher material costs than once were expected to moderate into 2023 have not at this time. This has pushed the Task Force to look hard at what is possible with the inevitable need to change or cut items. We will still have a finished product that we can be proud of, one that

will enhance our worship experience, allow us to gather, and provide space that furthers our mission to others.

Partners in our pursuit include Busch Architects, the lead in design efforts, Apex Companies, providing construction management experience, and Donlar Construction, Construction Manager at Risk, similar to a General Contractor, but engaged earlier in the process by providing cost estimates and building techniques as iterations of design are produced. Task Force members include Greg Ackerson, Francis Fernandez, Dennis Grabowski, Nancy Jenkins, Kathie Karsnia, Pastor Joanna, Rochelle Poore, Tracie Russell, Sandy Schmoll, Brook Vander Leest and Charlie Wold. The Task Force has been meeting regularly throughout the past year. The initial meetings were geared toward providing options for the congregation to comment on, and provide momentum for our capital campaign. The Transforming results established the financial value that then focused our attention to greater building details. Bringing Donlar on board gave the Task Force the voice from the construction industry, further adjusting our vision to what is possible.

Next on our agenda is to determine the scope of work for the final bidding documents that will be released to subcontractors. There is a high likelihood that there will be alternates that we could choose to accept or reject for those items that would be nice, but if too costly, ignored. We believe that bid documents will be on the street by the end of January. A rough construction schedule would have a start this Spring when the ground is frost free, likely April sometime. Completion is anticipated to be this November. Expect disruptions in accessibility but not in service. The Farmers Market will remain at Grace through the

construction season. Charlie Wold



Transforming Recap

In November we began our relationship with Donlar, who is our construction manager at risk. (A CMAR has responsibility to negotiate a guaranteed maximum price during the design phase thus the

construction manager will be responsible for any costs that exceed that amount). Our team has been working closely with Donlar as they put together estimates and Busch Architects as we finalize designs. Our initial estimates are much higher than anticipated. In part, because the cost of materials has increased a lot over the last year. For example, a unit of steel has quadrupled! All of this means that we have had to reexamine the scope of our project. We do ask everyone to join us as we pray for God's help as we make hard choices about what our priorities are, and how to move forward in a budget conscience way. I want you to know that our team has spent hours in conversations and in examination of what is best for the future of Grace and all its ministries.

Some changes that we have already made to our project are that we have decided not to include the two additional offices that were additions on the Southeast side of Grace. We have also cut the Narthex expansion. We will still renovate our kitchen; however we plan to take a different approach that will work within our current building structure and doesn't bump out like it had been initially presented.

Please join us on February 5th in worship for an update on the project. Also, please feel free to reach out to any members of our team about what is happening. We look forward to sharing with you. Pastor Joanna Mitchell



Reflection

"I Carry a Story Inside" by Nancy Jenkins

Since both pastors were scheduled to attend a youth event offsite during worship on Wednesday, December 21st, and because it was Grace's "Blue Christmas" service, I was asked to share a reflection that evening. Initially, I struggled to figure out what I should share but eventually the words came to me. I asked several people for their feedback on my reflection, I incorporated their edits, and I practiced giving my talk in the sanctuary. That Wednesday evening, however, there was a winter storm and all after school activities for most school districts were canceled as well as all Grace events. Several of my reflection and it was too bad that my effort had been wasted. I didn't actually have any regrets, however, because I knew how much writing my reflection had helped me process my grief about losing my mom last March.



The next day Pastor Maria graciously offered me the opportunity to share my reflection at the January 4th Wednesday evening worship instead and immediately I had resistance to this idea. "What is going on inside of me? Why don't I say yes like I did in November when Pastor Maria asked me? What's the difference?" The truth was that I couldn't see past Christmas. I couldn't imagine my January birthday without my mom. I couldn't imagine telling my Blue Christmas story amid the newness of January and so I said no. I declined the opportunity to share my reflection. It felt like the window for telling my story had come and gone like a flash of lightning. The reflection, once excited and ready to face the world, had retreated back inside of me, deep within. That evening I wrote this poem in response to how I felt about my reflection.

I Carry a Story Inside

Saw and felt the light of day for a time It rose with my breath, found its voice, and took flight It echoed into the universe Instead of waving goodbye and leaving me Or circling around me Now it is hidden deep within I hold it close Buried gently beneath the layers Of tender, sacred, holy soil Why did it recede? Was the light too strong? Was my voice or my body too weak? Was the winged flight too scary? I know no answers, only that I carry a story inside



Art Project

Last July, amid the busyness of life at Grace without Pastor Maria, Pastor Joanna announced one morning that she would like to do a congregational art project this fall. The goal was to have two banners in the sanctuary by mid-January when the pastors begin their sermon series on the book of Matthew which includes "The Beatitudes". Pastor Joanna had found online several large-scale coloring pages featuring "The Beatitudes" and this artwork was to somehow be transformed into the cloth banners in the sanctuary. Pastor Joanna had led a congregational art project at her former church

and so she had the vision for how this would work and what the outcome would look like. As the volunteer assigned to coordinate this project, I was several steps behind in envisioning what the endproduct would look like.

Special thanks to Kristi Evanger who provided finishing touches to the original paper "tiles" before they were sent to the printers, and to Jan Margotto who glued a backing to both banners which allows them to be displayed.

Truthfully, the process was far from perfect and often messy. Paint and water were spilled numerous times. Our original paper didn't accept the watercolors paints as we had anticipated. The second set of paper tiles ended up costing more than expected. One of the tiles was much too dark and had to be redone. The paints had to be diluted for the second banner. The printing company often didn't follow up as desired. As Project Manager, I made my own mistakes along the way. For example, I didn't keep proper track of the computer files containing the tiles and I had to bug Pastor Joanna more than once for her to re-send them to me.

One morning shortly after the second banner was finished, I woke up with these words on my mind:



"His banner over me is love." These words are from the Bible (Song of Solomon 2:4) and also from a song. "He brought me to his banqueting table, his banner over me is love." I sang these words at Sunday School as a child and there were hand motions which I loved (and which hopefully made up for my lack of vocal quality). I never really understood the full meaning of the lyrics of this song when I was a child, and so I Googled, "his banner over me is love" and this is what was written:

"Child, my banner over you is love. Banners are proclamations, bold statements of fact displayed over people, places, and things. They are indisputable declarations meant for all to see." I love it! This IS why I Google things! His banner over us is love! These two Beati-

tude banners over us are love.

Thanks to supporters like you, Family Promise in Anoka County continued to serve children and families experiencing home-

lessness and housing insecurity throughout 2022. In the past year, we have served over **55 families, including 145 children** between our Prevention, Shelter, and Housing Stabilization programs. Recently, two families in our Shelter program were able to transition from homelessness to permanent housing, just in time for the holidays. *This was possible because of the support they received from you*, through Family Promise in Anoka County.

We have been sharing with you our plans to develop a static a static Guest House. We are happy to announce everything is coming together for our Guest House project. The commercial building will be available for us to get in, start making plans, and prepare for the renovations as soon as January. There is going to be a great deal of work to do in the new year, but I'm excited we have the opportunity.

To help keep everything moving forward, we are getting together some teams of people to help with the early stages of the project, including messaging, fundraising, and renovation. If you are interested in helping with one of these temporary committees, we'd appreciate the help!

As we work our way to Lent we have a couple of new series starting! First, No Problem: A 4-week study from the Old & New Testament on LOVING OTHERS. Apologies—they're hard to give, but they're sometimes hard to receive, too. When you're the one who has hurt someone else, saying you're sorry (and actually meaning it) takes work and practice. But when you're the one who's been hurt by someone else, things get even more complicated. What if you don't want to forgive them? What if they don't seem sorry? What if they won't even admit they're wrong? What if they've moved on, but you're still not over it? In this 4-week series from the Gospels, we'll find out what it means to truly give (and receive) forgiveness. We'll discover that when you need forgiveness, it's not enough to just apologize. And when you've been hurt and need to forgive, we'll explore the importance of shifting your perspective, remembering God forgave first, and remembering Jesus knows what it's like to be hurt.

Next, *On The Flip Side*: A 4-week study from the Prophets & Gospels on Justice.

When Jesus was on earth, he wasn't exactly known for telling people what they wanted to hear. Jesus' message was unlike any message people had ever heard before. He didn't give shallow motivational speeches or feel-good sermons. He didn't recycle the same messages other religious leaders were teaching. He flipped people's ideas about God, the world, and themselves completely upside down usually in uncomfortable ways. And that's always how God's words have worked! 
