Stuck in Holy Saturday: Chaos, Disruption

and the Promise of Easter Morning

I have never paid much attention to Holy Saturday until a friend invited me to read about it in a mental health book. Holy Saturday is this place in between the death and resurrection of Jesus. For those who love the Easter Vigil, like Pastor Maria, this worship invites you to experience the chaos of the Easter story in its darkness, disruption, and move toward hope, promise and resurrection. It is dramatic and filled with elements that inspire our senses to participate in worship. It occurred to me recently that I have been stuck in Holy Saturday for a



while now and often don't see the rising of the sun, or the light coming near. Instead, I feel stuck in the darkness.


Now don't get me wrong, I am not without hope, but as Paul says, "...for who hopes for what is seen?" I long for what I do not see, which would be the promise of Jesus right in front of me, leading me down the path of what is next. The latest disruption in our building project being way over budget has invited me to revisit the darkness. There is grief, frustration, and an awareness that we must move forward. I feel as if I have stumbled upon a tomb and the rock is in the way. And like the women on Easter morning, I am wondering how we might roll away the stone that is in front of us. The truth is I don't know how to move the stone yet. In some ways, I feel like our next steps forward in discernment of what is next, and how to proceed is a little bit like walking in darkness. However, last Sunday (March 12th), when I announced this latest hiccup in our building project and invited you to a family meeting, we had very good representation from the Grace community, even though it was Spring Break. People asked thoughtful questions in which I felt both heard and affirmed. When I looked around the room at members of the Building Task Force, I knew that I didn't stand alone. We stood together in leadership. I am so blessed to have such gifted leaders who follow through and research options, so that we aren't leaving any stone unturned. I am beyond grateful.

I wonder where do we look when we stumble along in the dark? The women in the Easter story stayed on the path that was ahead of them. They kept walking in the darkness, even though they were quite certain that the path they were on would lead to the grave. Little did they know that an earthquake would come and roll away the stone. Little did they know that Jesus would meet them on the path. Little did they know that this disruption would change their lives, their faith, their hope forever.

People of Grace, I don't know what darkness you might be walking in today. But I do know that we have a God who waits for us on this path, invites us to come and see. I don't know what barriers you need to remove from your life, but we have a God who moves stones and opens up tombs. I don't know how lonely you feel, but I assure you we have a God, named Emmanuel, who has promised that God will be with you always till the end of the age.

If you are stuck in Good Friday or Holy Saturday, do not be afraid, the light will shine, and hope will come. For if God can overcome death and the grave, then God can do anything!

A Warm Welcome

Last week I sat in on one of the many ministry team meetings at Grace! The group was discussing worship they had attended and an upcoming event they were planning for the congregation. Many around the table buzzed with excitement because they had met many different guests at worship that day. Some were folks who had returned to Grace after many years, others, first time

visitors. In the same way we get excited by flowers poking their heads through the snow, these new visitors are signs of hope. Signs that God is up to something, in and through us here at Grace! That is not to say God isn't at work in the desert wilderness, God is there too! It is just that these new faces are reassuring and hopeful signs, and I am grateful for them!

Since the beginning of January, we have been studying The Gospel According to St. Matthew. In his telling of the life and times of Jesus, Matthew shares many of the stories Jesus tells, teaching about the kingdom of heaven. These parables begin: "The Kingdom of Heaven is like..." These stories call us to imagine how we might live differently now to bring God's kingdom here. How might it be possible for God's reign in human hearts to begin right here, right now, with us, and through how we live? What is our identity in the kingdom, and how might we be patient and also prepare for kingdom life right now?

Throughout Lent we have studied the book B.L.E.S.S. : 5 ways to love your neighbor and change the world by Jon and Dave Fergusason. This book too, invites us to imagine the real life implications of living the way Jesus did: B-beginning with prayer, L-listening, E-eating, S-serving, and S-sharing our story. What would happen if we prayed for our neighbors, listened to them, ate with them, served them in meaningful ways, might we then have an opportunity to share our story with them about the difference God has made in our life? These 5 simple practices invite us to love our neighbors in a way that Jesus loved those he ministered to. And we are all proof that what Jesus did, how Jesus lived, did in fact change the world!

So what does kingdom life, identity, patience, preparation, and "BLESSing" have to do with the people God has brought into our lives? The new faces at worship, the new neighbor down the street? My hope is that we won't miss our opportunity to be welcoming.

As our meeting continued, one of the participants asked if we pastors could point out those who might be new, so we don't miss the newcomers. Yes! We can! (actually this is one of Pastor Joanna's super talents. She is really great at connecting people!) We can point out who is new. And as well intentioned as the question is, you don't need **us** to connect you. God calls each of us to this work! You may feel their faces look familiar and so you may be hesitant to introduce yourself. I have never been offended when someone asks my name again. I am quite simply delighted that they have recognized me or noticed my presence and reached out to say hello and get to know me.

We also heard from a member of Grace who hadn't been welcomed well here. They stated it had been a long time before anyone introduced themselves or even smiled and said hello. Often feeling sideways glances instead of a friendly hello. I know I do this. Usually I am trying to determine if I know the person or not and so end up looking at them weird. This is not the way forward people!

Interserve Update On Children,

The work together is continuing to flow nicely along. Grace has an amazing team with a heart for God and youth, as well as considerable skills that are so valuable to this process. Some are doing screening calls, some scheduling, and all have contributed to slim down the number of questions to make sure we are asking questions that align with Grace's needs.

The Search team is made up of two members from the listening team to ensure continuity throughout the process Tom Baker and April Anderson, as well as Pastor Maria, Mike Russell, Chrissy Gast, Mary Coleman, Lynn Noren, Michele Behnke-Nead, with myself (Molly Schroeder) facilitating the process. The role of InterServe in this portion of the work is a Non-Voting Facilitator. While I will suggest warnings and concerns, the decision for hiring must solely be by the team. I will help Pastor Maria discern whether or not a candidate is the right fit for the team and help recruit and tap into resources that help in the search process.

There have been several applicants already and are working through the process with each candidate, screening and setting up interviews.

But all these changes will be for naught if we have not changed ourselves to be welcoming of ALL who enter the building! Next time you are at church, introduce yourself to someone you don't know. Learn a fun fact about them and share it with someone else, connecting that person to them as well. Let us be welcoming, O God, to those you send our way. Amen.



Autism Awareness Day and Moving from Awareness to Acceptance

April 2nd is considered Autism Awareness Day. This day was created to help our world better understand what it means to have autism. It is a complex neurological diagnosis that presents itself very differently from person to person, which is why it is considered a spectrum. There are two main areas of need related to social communication skills and repetitive stereotypical behaviors. Social communication skills needs can look very different from someone who does not use verbal language to someone who has long in-depth conversations, but misses subtle social cues. Re-



petitive stereotypical behaviors can look like hand flapping or rocking, to someone frustrated when their schedule is interrupted. When individuals were first diagnosed with autism, it was only those with the most significant needs. Recently our understanding of autism has grown to encompass many more individuals who still need some help, support, and understanding, but have less significant needs. This has led to a world where I am sure many of you not only know someone with autism, but love someone with autism.

Now that awareness of autism has grown, moving from awareness to acceptance is essential. Many people see autism not as a disability but rather as a form of diversity, neurodiversity. Individuals with autism spend 1,000s of hours learning how to look, act, and speak like neurologically typical individuals. It is time for the rest of the world to spend some time moving towards accepting individuals with autism and celebrating things that make them unique and wonderful people. Many people with autism will still need support in schools and the workplace, but acceptance will go a long way in making this world a better place.

What can you do to be more accepting of autism? 1) Learn more about autism and talk to or watch videos created by advocates who have autism. 2) Provide visuals whenever possible, as processing verbal language and content can be difficult. 3) Provide clear schedules of events, and whenever possible, ample time to prepare for changes that must be made. 4) Don't be easily insulted by what is said to you; for example, they will tell you if they don't like your haircut. 5) Stop insisting on eye and physical contact, such as a handshake and hug. 6) Be aware that if you have met one person with autism, you have met one person with autism. If you have questions or comments, I would be happy to answer any of them. Own Your Faith Okoboji Retreat and Confirmation


