#### What Fills Your Bucket?

A few summers ago, Luther Crest Bible camp in Alexandria, Minnesota had their theme verse as John 7:19-"And let anyone who believes in me drink for the scripture says: 'and out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living waters." The campers for the entire summer memorized this verse, both studying it and singing and shouting it, over and over again. I will confess that the idea of living waters sometimes confuses me, but I am pretty sure I have just been too literal regarding what Jesus is offering. Recently, I sat with a friend who invited me to ponder



the question of "What fills your bucket?" I didn't have an answer, but I could tell her quickly that my bucket was pretty empty. I am tired and have been for a while now. I don't know that I realized the extent of my exhaustion because I have been too busy, but (thankfully) things have slowed down a little bit over at Grace Lutheran Church. Things have also slowed down a bit in my own personal life. My dad's house is sold and he will be moving to his new apartment in just a few weeks. My daughter has moved home from college and I don't have a student graduating again for a few more years. I feel as if I have come to the end of a marathon, and while I am not going to quit running, I do need some time to rest and recover.

This is what summer is often about: recharging our batteries, recovering after a long winter. There is a reason that God commands us to honor the sabbath day and keep it holy. While there are reasons regarding justice and equality, God also knows that it is good for our weary soul to rest and recover. The sabbath is made for humans because we all need to slow down, to be quiet and to quit doing and just be. Summer is a time to quench our thirst and drink the living waters that Jesus offers, or to put it another way it's a time to fill our buckets.

So, what does that look like for you? Is it time away at the cabin or on the lake? Is it a hike in the woods? Is it time alone, or gathering with your friends? As a midline extravert– I need a little of both. There is nothing I like better than spending the day on the couch reading a book and just allowing it to absorb my entire brain, but I will definitely get off the couch to meet friends for happy hour and conversation. Last week, I was away at the Festival of Homiletics (preaching) with Pastor Maria and this was a bucket-filling event. While it was a lot of people, it was a chance to connect with colleagues and a chance to hear God's word from wonderful preachers and teachers. I need a mix of it all. I need quiet time, and also connection. For me, my bucket is filled when I have the opportunity to learn and to grow, but when I am not bombarded with demands and big decisions. It involves a chance to look and listen for God, in nature, and through my interactions with others.

I don't know what fills your bucket, but I hope you will take time to consider it. And I hope that part of your sabbath this summer will include not only getting away, but also drawing closer to God. Hearing God's word in scripture, or through maybe joining us for our Zoom bible study on Thursday morning (good news you can join us from your cabin). I hope you will spend time in prayer, not only talking to God but also listening to what God is inviting you to consider in your life, and how God is pouring a river of living water into you.

a time for war, and a time for peace.



## Ministries



This spring, Family Promise begins transitioning into a new trauma-informed way to shelter and serve families experiencing homelessness with the opening of the first phase of the Family Promise Campus. The Family Promise Campus is more centrally located and accessible to the families we serve, partnering organizations that assist them, and other resources families need. The campus has two properties. One property is commercially zoned with a building for our offices and service center and space for future expansion. The second property is residentially zoned with a house that will soon shelter one family at a time and land for future micro-sized apartments to shelter additional families.

"Our hope is that, when a young child looks back at their family's time in our program, they won't even realize they were in a shelter," says Executive Director David Frei.

We hope you will share our Family Promise Campus vision and help us raise the \$260,000 total goal by the end of the year. These funds are dedicated to renovate our new spaces to serve families and children experiencing homelessness and building plans for phase two.
