Listen, grow, SERVE

August 22nd is the anniversary of my ordination! It is hard to believe that I have been a pastor for 3 years! Pastor Joanna had gathered information from the congregation, Vision Board and staff about Grace, and through this lens our mission was born! *Grace Lutheran is a community of faith united by God's love to listen, grow and serve in the name of Jesus, so that all might experience grace*. Each year since then we have used this statement to focus our year together. We started by listening to God, to each other, to our neighbors. The next year we focused on growing, in faith and in connection with each other and our neighbors. This year our focus is SERVE! This is an area Grace excels!

When I think about the word serve, I first think of outreach and all the things we do! Through the many outreach ministries at Grace and even with each other. Grace loves to serve! We also see Jesus taking time to himself for prayer. Another focus of our faith formation at Grace will be on spiritual practices. Spiritual practices like prayer, Bible study, walking, eating are all simple practices, things we do everyday that shape who we are.

Spiritual gifts and spiritual practices, who we are and what we do. Learning about these areas in the context of our faith formation journey will help us be intentional about our service! A Message From The Weikle's

There are no words. We don't know what to say. We are trying to put into words that which is beyond our language. Words of deep sorrow and words of deep gratitude always sound inadequate. For the past few weeks people have come before me with "I don't know what to say." And yet they did know what to feel. Again, only an attempt at putting words to the depth of feeling. Shock. Loss. Inner physical pain, especially around the heart and chest. Clearly shared feelings. Now, as we move through the aftershocks of Matthew's passing, we read the cards, we recall the kindnesses and generosity, we have no words to express our deep gratitude. The Family of Grace stepped into our loss and has truly shared it. We acknowledge the work, the efforts of so many people, the pastors, the musicians, the amazing kitchen team, the church staff, those who set up the church building to receive and welcome those who were mourning with us, the ushers and sound people, and for anyone we are missing, we thank you. For the outpouring of love and comfort in the form of cards, food and hospitality for our family, and memorials for Matthew, we thank you. The day of the funeral had a profound feeling of flowing, palpable love. The source of that love is Jesus, God, and Holy Spirit. So we also acknowledge and give thanks to the Triune God who called into being the Family of Grace. Thank you.

Some people have asked where memorials are to be directed. We have decided on 3 places that seem to echo Matthew's gifts. Haven for Heroes is a veteran support organization in Anoka. Matthew worked there for a summer. Not only did he learn work skills, but he also learned to walk alongside people who were going through a time of healing and recovery. The second is Center for Leadership and Engagement, an organization dedicated to helping people in Minneapolis who long for welcome, safety, and belonging. Finally, we will give a portion designated to the Children, Youth and Family Ministry here at Grace. The children's programming that Matthew received laid the groundwork for a loving, generous, and bold life. We pray that children will continue to be blessed. Thank you, The Weikle's



Faith and Community Partnership With Sand Creek Elementary

- Sand Creek Monthly Meetings and Sharing Grace Food Bags - We meet the first Thursday at 3:00pm for our meeting and then packing our monthly Sharing Grace Food Bags during the school year.
- School Supplies are collected mid-July to September 4th and delivered to Sand Creek September 9th. Communications of the school needs and collecting the school supply donations will be ongoing during this timeframe. Donations should be brought to the Narthex.
- Donations for warm mittens/gloves, hats, and possibly emergency clothing needs for student's accidents will be held during the months of October/November and delivered to Sand Creek as we accumulate enough for delivery and their needs.
- Christmas Adopt-A-Family-This event goes into the blue signup sheets mid-November, prior to black Friday shopping on Nov. 24th, for the Grace "Adopters" to sign up for the families. The collection of the gifts and/or gift cards will be in December for delivery to Sand Creek on Dec. 22nd.
- Holiday Food Box Packing-These are approximate packing dates according to the holiday dates. We usually pack from 8-9am.
- Thanksgiving Baskets Packing and delivery on Nov. 21st in the morning to S.C. We will be asking for 10-14lb. frozen turkey donations during the two weeks prior Nov. 5th & 12th.
- Christmas Baskets Packing and delivery on Dec. 22nd in the morning to SC. We may be asking for Simek's frozen lasagna donations during the two weeks prior Dec. 11th & 18th.
- Spring Break/No school March 11-19, 2024-Packing and delivery on March 8th in the morning to S.C. We usually get Thrivent Action Dollars to pay for this event.
- Easter March 31, 2024 No packing needed, we give gift cards to be delivered March 21st to S.C. We may ask for \$25 gift cards from Cub or Walmart two weeks prior to this date March 18th & 25th.




Mental Health Ministry

Since 2010, Family Promise has provided temporary shelter and case management for over 250 families in partnership





This spring, Family Promise began transitioning into a new trauma-informed way to shelter and serve families experiencing homelessness with the opening of the first phase of the Family Promise Campus. Faith community partners and volunteers continue to be essential partners in our work, although their contributions may look different.

Building micro-apartments is the next phase of campus development. This fosters independence and avoids potential stigma for families and children. "Our hope is that, when a young child looks back at their family's time in our program, they won't even realize they were in a shelter," says Executive Director David Frei.

We hope Grace Lutheran Church will continue to share our Family Promise Campus vision and help us raise the \$260,000 total goal by the end of the year. These funds are dedicated to renovate our new spaces to serve families and children experiencing homelessness and building plans for phase two.






Sunday School
