Dear People of Grace,

I have enrolled in a two-week class at the Living School, through the Center for Action and Contemplation. One of the aspects of this class is to do deep listening and prayer. In the first week, the readings provided for our reflection used these words: "calmed and quieted my soul," "I wait and listen for the sound of the genuine," and "we can't rush, the season and we can't call for the rain." These are the lines I have been stuck on. Calmed and quieted, wait and listen, can't rush, can't call for the rain. I don't think we do a good job of this as a society. I shared the calmed and quieted piece with someone, who responded asking, "how do you do that?" Great question! How do we calm and quiet our soul?



I just shut the door to my own office because the hallways are loud right now as our daycare gets ready for their Fall Festival. I see, families coming and going every day, and their souls are not quieted! Their lives are busy with little kids, illnesses, jobs, and schedules. As my kids have entered high school and college, things are quieter at our house, but I am still working on calming and quieting my soul. In those quiet moments, it is so easy to look for a distraction, like picking up my cell phone and surfing the internet mindlessly, or to call or text a friend. We tend to fill space with noise so that we can avoid the silence.

But what might the silence be inviting us to think about? As the days grow shorter, and we move into the busy holiday season, how might you find yourself turning off some of the noise and tuning into your spirit, and God's voice within you: a voice that affirms you for who you are, just as you are.

A dear friend of mine shared recently that she overthinks conversations. She will often send a text after a coffee date and say, "I'm sorry, if I sounded snarky," or something like this. Almost always, no one thought she was snarky, but she is overthinking her own actions. When she confessed this to our small group, we all started to share about how we overthink too, and then we gave thanks for the vulnerability of our friendship to tell this fear. Sometimes, I think that we are afraid to turn things off and listen more deeply because we start to overthink. We start to judge, we start to listen to the voice within ourselves that says we are inadequate or not enough. If this is the case, then we need another starting place for our reflection and for our quiet. Because that is the voice of fear within you, that is the face of the liar, or the devil (if you will) that fills you with insecurities and self-doubts. Could you begin your time of quiet, hearing the words of the Psalmist, who pronounces: You are fearfully and wonderfully made. Or the voice of Isaiah who states: "I have called you by name, you are mine." Or the voice of God, who states: You are my beloved, I delighted in choosing you."?

The scripture passage that I have been reading states: I have calmed and quieted my soul like a weaned child. It helps that I have an infant room down the hallway from my office. An amazing thing happens when an infant is feeding, especially when they are little, they turn the world off and that is the only thing that matters. Might I imagine getting that close to God, to nestle in the crook of God's arm and be held and turn everything else off except God's warmth, God's love, God's grace. Might you do the same. Perhaps we will discover that when we listen to God's voice, our souls will be calmed and quieted and we will be filled with overflowing love. Thanks be to God!

Slow down. Turn God-Ward.

The first week in October a group of us served with Habitat for Humanity Twin Cities. It was my first time working with the organization and aside from Jimmy John's for lunch I didn't really know what to expect. When we arrived at our site, we were immediately told that we actually wouldn't be working at that site, but 6 blocks away at another site. Still I had no idea what to expect, but we trudged on, eager to help. Our Site leader was a man named Jimi. To paint a picture, he wore a Hawaiian



shirt, listened to jazz guitar while we worked, and Jimi loved to talk! Our instruction for the day took half of the morning it seemed, and once we got to work he exclaimed, "You are the most efficient crew I have ever had." He gave me a special task to slow people down. Reminding us that we were supposed to be having a good time too, not just working! What I realized working that day with Jimi was the importance of slowing down. A few of us in our haste painted walls the wrong color and had to re-paint them or while cutting in, splashed a little wall color onto the ceiling and had to touch that up too.

There is always work to be done. But it will get done. And site supervisor Jimi is right. We should slow down and talk to one another. We are supposed to be having a good time too.

Last week our Faith Practices and Neighboring Practices team had our first gathering. There were teams from 16 different churches in the Minneapolis Area Synod. Over the course of 24 hours, we focused on two keynote practices: daily prayer and one-to-ones. That's it! We shared meals together, learned a little, and conversed a lot. Once again, I was reminded to slow down. Instead of driving to produce and program, striving for measurable outcomes, we were invited to slow down. Sit with God and with one another and in doing so we listened, learned, and grew in faith. Our spiritual directors for the weekend invited us into thinking about prayer and daily prayer as any time we focus God-ward! You can be sitting in silence, journaling, creating art, walk-



ing, conversing and more --all of this can be considered prayer! They encouraged us to set aside time daily for a prayer practice, a time of turning God-ward. We were also invited into the practice of one to one conversations. You might be thinking of a conversation with two people. And you would only be half right. One-to-one conversations are intentional conversations between two people intended to build authentic relationships, discover gifts and strengths, identify self-interest, and gather information. These conversations require intention and attention from the person requesting the conversation as well as purposeful and curious listening. Meaning if you are invited to a one-to-one, chances are you will do 70-80% of the talking during the conversation. And the person who invited you will listen and ask questions, drawing you deeper with the motivation to learn what is important to you! Peter Block, one of our presenters, is convinced small group conversations had in this way, as well as probing questions will change the world for the better. You may be a skeptic like me, thinking but what will we DO to change the world? What must we produce? What I learned is we can simply pray, turning God-ward. And be intentionally in relationship with each other- drawing one another deeper through questions and understanding. This is my invitation to you as we turn the corner from fall into the holiday seasons. An invitation to slow down, savor time spent God-ward and in intentional relationship building conversation. Who knows, but let's check in, in a couple of months and see how we feel?! Thanks be to God! Pastor Maria Markman


