Wednesday Evening at Grace - 2030 ~ Chrissy Gast's Vision

The year is 2030. Our family walks through the doors of Grace on a Wednesday evening and are welcomed by the smell of garlic—spaghetti is being cooked by one of our congregants. Our kids run off to greet friends, play shuffleboard and eat dinner. As I look around the room, I see a diverse mix of people—young and old, tenured members and visitors, a spectrum of gender, ethnic diversity, abilities and gifts. As 6pm approaches, the kids and their friends head off to their rooms and the adults gather with their respective study/small groups—all led by members of the church. Kevin and I have joined a group of other couples doing a video study on marriage.

The church hadn't changed much from the outside. The red brick is still there, and the green facade is still standing tall—now all other buildings have green accents too. It is now officially the neighborhood staple. The welcome team still opens the door with a smile and offers a handwritten visitor card. This is a Lutheran church after all—the coffee pot is still on, and there are always treats that follow the service.

Instead of just the traditional children's message, the high school kids run the kids' message on certain occasions. Today is Nora's day (age 16) and she is center stage, sharing a message that sounds remarkably like what Pastor Joanna or Maria might have said five years ago. I smile and am reminded that no matter how much the world changes, the Bible remains the same. Church is still a gathering place where people want to find common connection and make their community a better place.

Youth are practicing parallel parking in our parking lot. Our garden continues to be filled with color and bringing vibrancy to our community. People can find a quiet place to pray and talk to God.

Inside the building, the great hall is buzzing with people. Jan Anderson is calling out bingo numbers to her farmstead friends. Someone just wone a pie. People are using small tables for Bible studies. Church and community members are working on the Andover Family Funfest.

The involvement of youth has increased across worship and in small groups as we continue to expand our intergenerational ministry.

Some groups would cross generations for example: crocheting, knitting and crafting or woodworking/construction/handywork. Meeting times that work for kids either in the evenings or on Sundays.


New things to look out for:












