



The Story Behind the Pocket Hug Project

Julie, Andy, and Sydney are members of Grace. Julie is a leader in Circle of Grace, and has taught Sunday School, Andy has been an Own Your Faith Mentor and a member of our Mental Health Team. Sydney attended Seeds of Grace and is now a 2nd grader.

As parents, we strive to raise our children well—to equip them with the tools they need to become kind, capable, and compassionate adults. But what does that really look like in practice? Did we nurture them in a way that encourages not just success, but also generosity, discipline, and faith—just as the Lord calls us to do?

Earlier this year, we had a conversation with our vibrant, kind-hearted 7-year-old daughter, Sydney. We wanted to help her grow in the area of "giving back," though we weren't exactly sure how that would take shape. It was simply a seed planted—one we hoped would bloom over time.

With the help of Tara, our amazing foreign exchange student, Sydney learned how to make loom bracelets. Inspired and excited, she decided she wanted to sell them. But knowing how time-intensive they are, we thought about adding something simpler that still carried meaning. With school fast approaching, I suggested including Pocket Hugs—a small, thoughtful gift with a big heart—and Sydney was immediately on board.

Just like that, a little business was born. Even more inspiring, Sydney decided from the start that she wanted to donate all her earnings to help others. We didn't yet know what that would look like, but she was fully in the driver's seat. And within just a short time, she had raised \$500 through her bracelets and hugs.

A month later, Sydney had the funds in hand—but still wasn't quite sure where to direct her support, or even what to call her project. Then tragedy struck at Annunciation School. That day, Sydney came home, and I sat down to gently explain what had happened—not to instill fear, but to offer understanding. As I spoke, she stopped me and said, with quiet conviction, that she knew exactly what she wanted to do.

It was simply a seed planted - one we hoped would bloom over time.

And that's how the Pocket Hug Project was born.

With her tender heart, love for others, and unwavering faith, Sydney has since raised over \$6,000 for the students and staff of Annunciation School, along with donating 450 Pocket Hugs. She's also extended her support to the ER workers at Children's Hospital and HCMC, donating 50 additional Pocket Hugs to those who care for others in their most vulnerable moments.



Sydney has always treasured the Pocket Hug we gave her when she started kindergarten. She doesn't carry it every day, but she knows that in moments of fear or uncertainty, she can hold it close as a reminder of the love surrounding her. That's exactly what she hopes to share with others: something small, but powerful—a tangible symbol of love and comfort.

All it took was a vision, a heart full of love, and the support of a caring community like ours. Together, we can continue to spread kindness, one Pocket Hug at a time.

We as parents are beyond proud of not only Sydney, but of this community that offers generosity in so many ways. Thank you to all who foster those loving hearts, big and small.

Sharing our Gifts: A Stewardship of the Whole Life

Our mission statement at Grace Lutheran Church is to listen, grow, and serve so that all might experience grace. I spend a lot of time listening. Listening to staff members as they do their ministry. Listening to members of our community as they struggle with health concerns and mourn the death of loved ones. Listening to people who are hungry and hurting. Listening to the news and people's opinions about world events. I also listen to God.

Listening to God happens in many ways: through scripture and Bible study, in silence, in worship, and in conversation. As people of faith, we listen to God and attempt to discern what God is saying, though it can be hard.

The Apostle Paul writes: "But what happens when we live God's way? God brings gifts into our lives, much the same way that fruit appears in an orchard—things like affection for others, exuberance about life, serenity. We develop a willingness to stick with things, a sense of compassion in the heart, and a conviction that a basic holiness permeates things and people. We find ourselves involved in loyal commitments, not needing to force our way in life, able to marshal and direct our energies wisely." — Galatians 5:22-23 The Message

Stewardship becomes the way we tend and share the fruit God has grown in us—offering back not just our financial resources but our whole selves.

Paul invites us to contemplate what it means to live God's way. You would think Paul would give us a list of things to do, like pray, read the Bible, memorize the 10 Commandments, and confess your sins. But Paul doesn't. Instead, he writes of the actions, and the gifts God gives to us. How God will bring us gifts. How God will plant in us seeds that will grow and in their growth change us and the world around us.

This passage reflects on the fruits of the Spirit, emphasizing that following God fills us with kindness, compassion, loyalty, and patience. Paul seeks transformation through God's love and Spirit, fostering hope and kindness, especially during challenging times. The desire for God's love and hope is expressed as a source of strength against fear and division.

Paul concludes by saying: "Since this is the kind of life we have chosen, the life of the Spirit, let us make sure that we do not just hold it as an idea in our heads or a sentiment in our hearts, but work out its implications in every detail of our lives." — Galatians 5:26-27

These gifts God plants in us naturally overflow into how we share our lives with others. Stewardship becomes the way we tend and share the fruit God has grown in us—offering back not just our financial resources but our whole selves.

Every fall at Grace, we are invited to make a commitment to our spiritual life. This is often focused on making financial gifts. One of the fruits of the spirit is indeed generosity. In a society that is often consumed with financial well-being, this is an important part of our spiritual growth, letting go of our need for control and making a commitment to give financially what God has given us.





Family Table

Family Table is an outreach program sponsored by several churches in the area including Grace. Families and individuals who take advantage of these meals have the opportunity through the network of Family Table to find a meal locally almost every day of the year! Some people who come to Family Table don't need a hot meal per se but appreciate the community and socialization it provides. Some have even become dear friends. Our volunteers also enjoy getting to know the guests.

Grace serves a hot meal to be eaten on site or taken home once a month on the third Sunday. Deb and Kevin Corey who regularly volunteer with Family table love it because they can bring their grandkids to help serve. And the grandkids love it too! They also appreciate serving with other members of Grace and getting to know people who maybe worship at different times. This is an easy ministry to get involved with as it takes a minimal time commitment (less than two hours) and all ages and abilities are welcome to participate!




