

Become a Communion Server!

Communion Servers help distribute the body and blood of Christ to those who are worshipping. If you have a heart for service, giving, and a desire to support our church community, join!

What does Communion Server Do?

- **Bread Server (Regular and Gluten Free)**
 - Use hand sanitizer before handing out bread.
 - Give out the Body of Christ to those in attendance by saying "the body of Christ given for you" as a piece of bread is given to the worshiper.
 - For those not taking bread, give them a blessing of love and kindness.
- **Communion Wine Server**
 - Present the tray of wine and white grape juice to those in attendance by saying "the blood of Christ shed for you" as the worshiper takes a glass out of the tray.
 - Rotate trays as one side becomes empty, so worshipers do not have to reach across the tray.
- **Communion Empty Wine Tray**
 - Present the empty tray as those in attendance can place their empty glass cup.
 - Rotate trays as one side becomes full, so worshipers do not have to reach across the tray.
- **Runner**
 - Watch over those who are serving bread, wine and juice, so that they do not run out.
 - Watch over those who have empty trays so that they do not overflow.
 - Collect trays and if needed condense the full cups into another tray and use to give to wine servers.
 - Watch over bread servers to be sure they have enough bread to give out.
